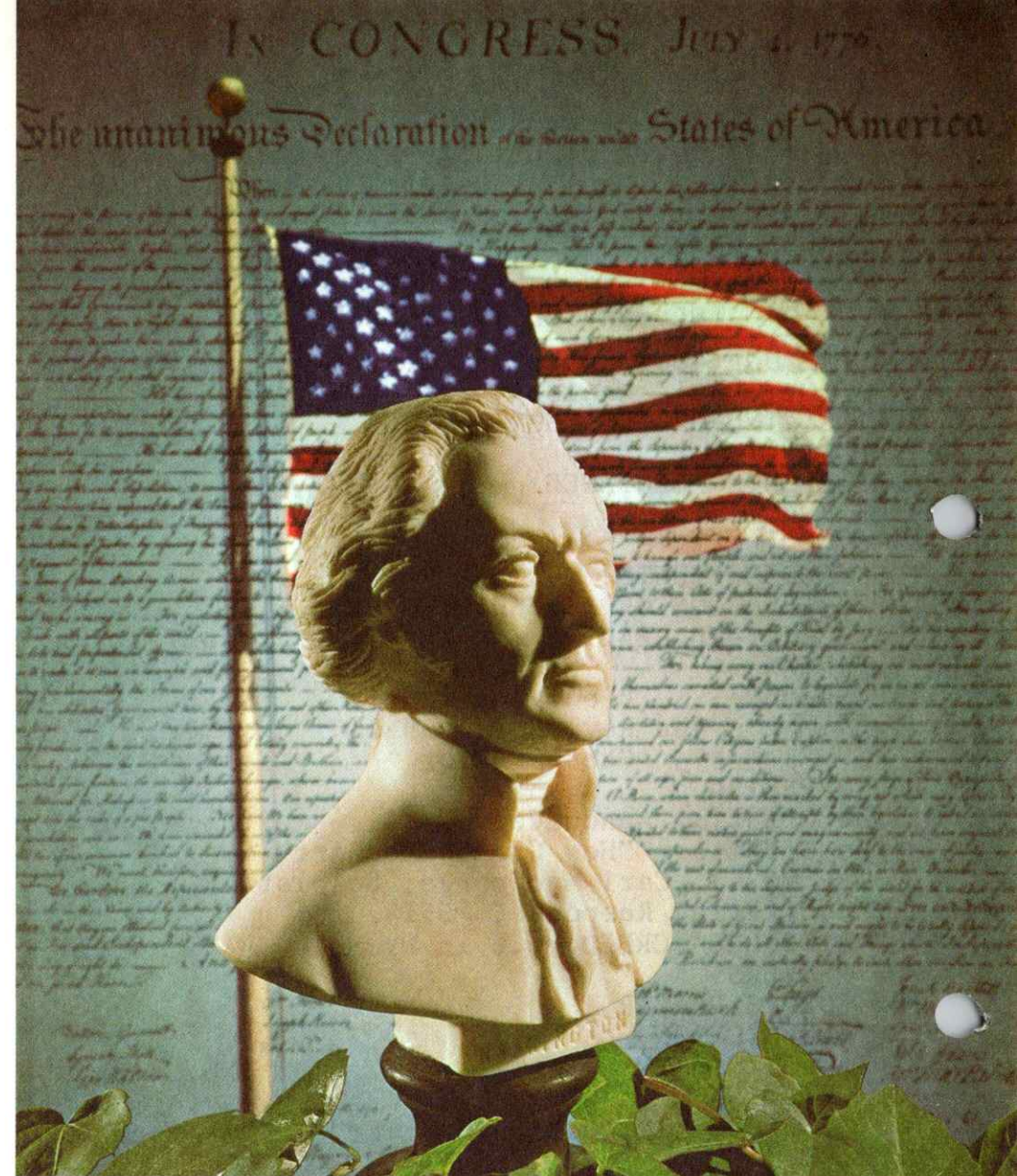

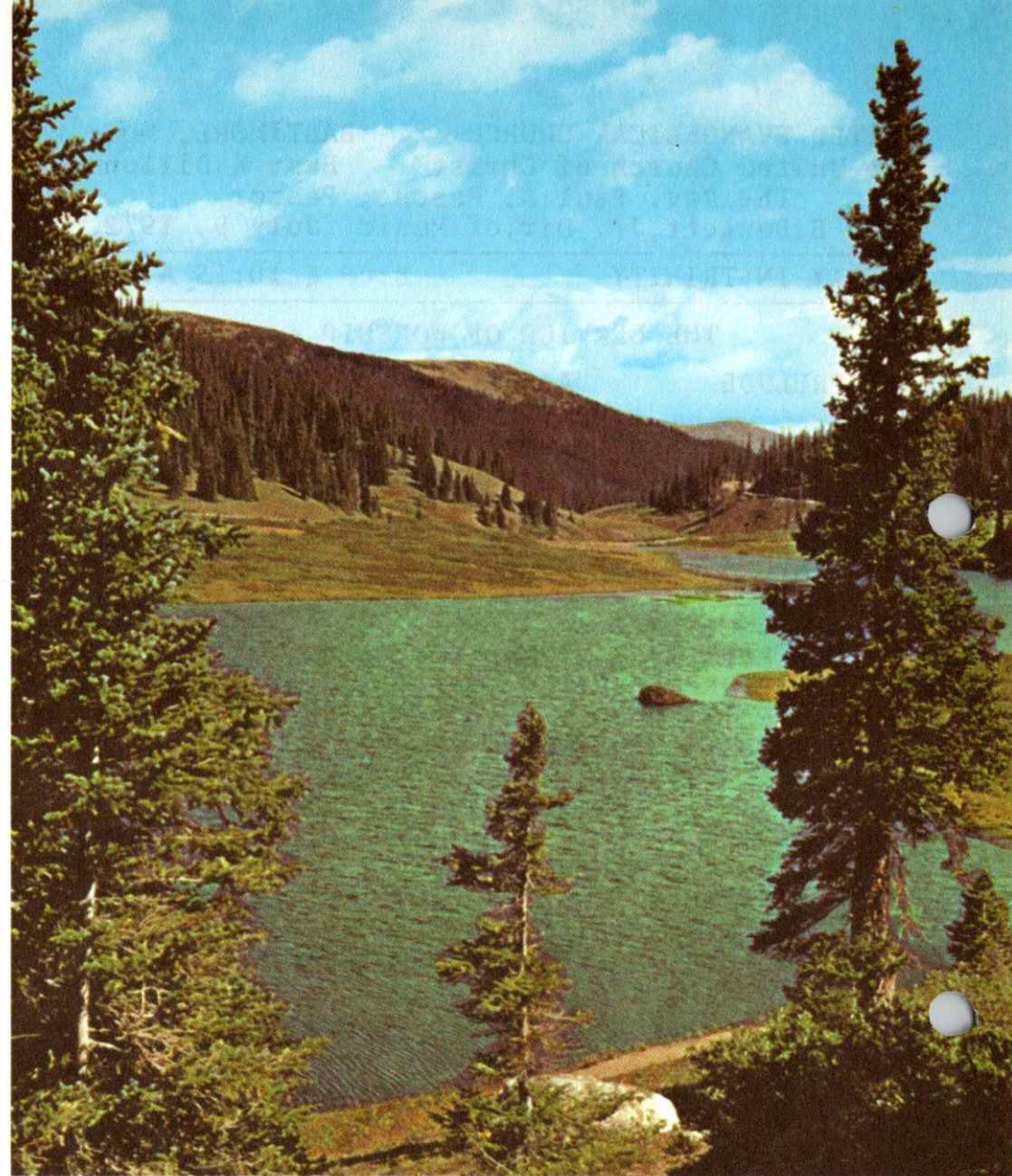
CANTON HAPPENING WILL SOON BEGIN

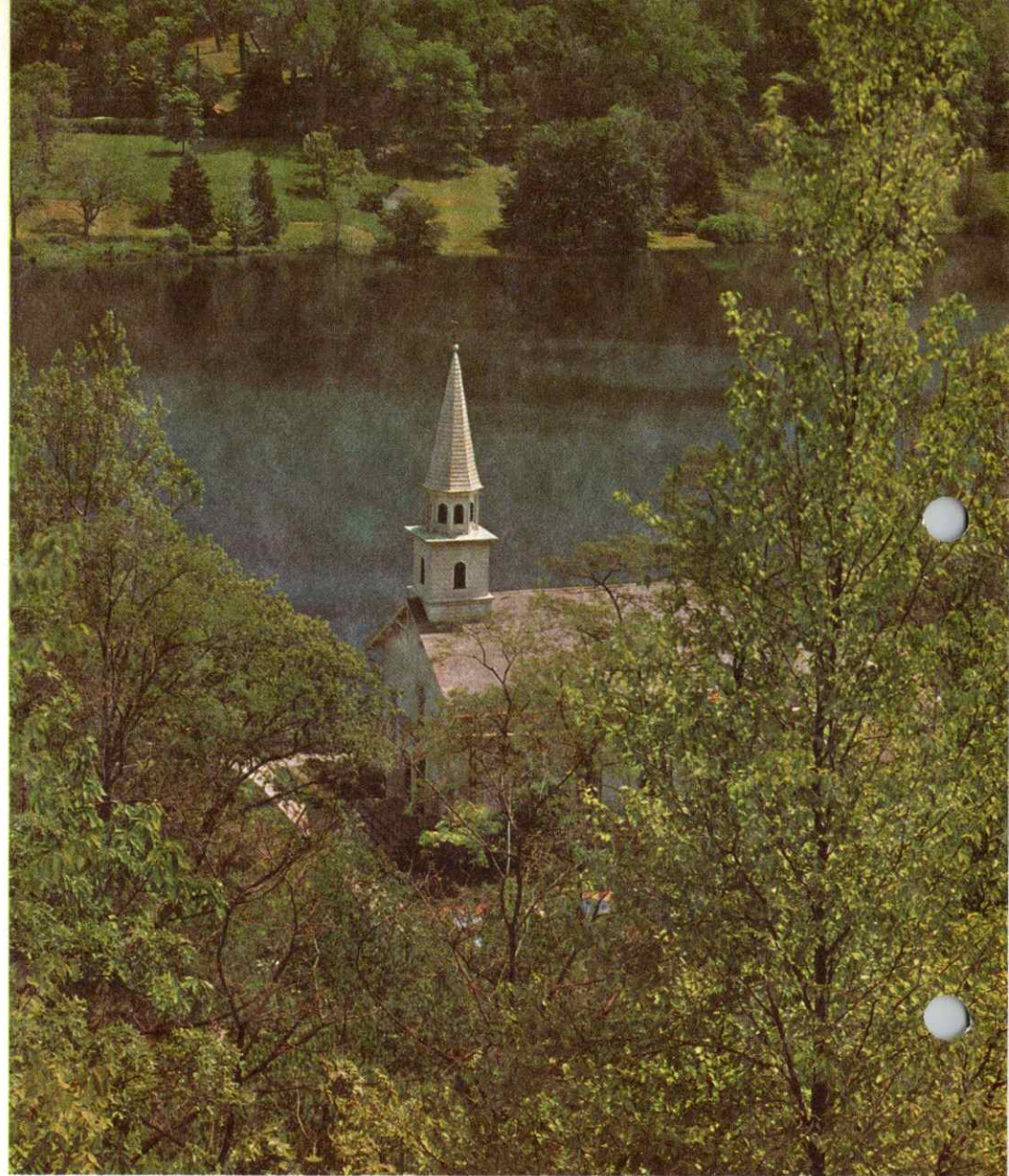
No Meetings here at church this week save the meeting of the Church Council on Aug. 23rd.
