#### A LENTEN VOW

The Holy Lenten season, beginning on March 7, may become a season of rich spiritual experience to us. The measure of such experience will depend upon the use we make of opportunities for self- examination and growth in spiritual knowledge. We who are Protestants believe that this season gives us the unique opportunity to gather 'beneath the cross of Jesus' in humility and con triteness, seeking for a new comprehension of our Lord, that we may translate His Passion into our own hearts in terms of love.

Special services are planned at United Evangelical Church to enable each to do just this. The invitation comes to all to make this Lent en season a meaningful one. Let us make our vows this Lent, not because we feel it is the thing to do but because we can benefit from the keeping of vows. No easy vow do we have in mind, such as merely giving up candy or picture shows during ent. It is well to discipline the body in this manner. But rather we have a vow of spiritual content in mind - to pray daily for your below ed Church; to read the Bible daily in your family circle; to attend the services of worship regularly; to speak to someone else about the Christ. Take the season of Lent in to the very center of your life.

April 15 - Palm Sunday Service of Confirmation, 10 a.m. Sermon: "Why Palm Sunday" at both services.

The traditional mid-week service will begin at 7:30 p.m. each Wednes day. These will be more simplified services than on Sundays.

Services during Holy Week will be held on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday(also service at 9 a.m. Fri.) beginning at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday service is a Communion Preparatory service, and all who are planning to come to the Sacrament during Holy Week or Easter should be at the Wednesday service to make preparation. Thursday and Friday services are Communion services.

### COFFEE HOUR AND BAKE SALE EACH LENTEN WEDNESDAY

At the conclusion of each Wednes day service(not Holy Week) a coffee hour is planned in Fellowship Hall, where we can stop for a cup of coffee and a donut, and chat together. At the same time each week a Bake Sale will be held by one of the organizations of the church. So, attend the services and then remain for a period of fellowship over a cup of coffee, and take the delicious home-made baked goods with you.

## LENTEN DIME-FOLDER FOR EACH FAMILY

A lenten Self-Denial Dime Foldwe will come to your family from the church for use during the season of Lent. It has a place for a dime for each day of Lent. As you have your family devotions, then also make a daily extra offering for United Evangelical Church through this dime folder. The folders are to be returned either on Good Friday or Easter. This special offering will be dedicated at the 10:15 Easter service. The offering will be used by your church for the payment of needed extra equipment for our expanded program.

### DAILY BIBLE READING SCHEDULE

Through the courtesy of the Mary land Bible Society the "Daily Bible Reading" chart is provided for your family. If you as a family are using "The Upper Room" for your family devotions, then these readings can be used at another time. Or, they can be used about the family table. Be a Bible-reading family during the Lenten season and make it a habit from then on.
