THE TIME OF DECISION

Billy Graham has a radio and TV how called "The Hour of Decision" in which this evangelist seeks to dramatize the importance of a decision for Jesus on the part of each child of God, not tomorrow but now.
Lent and Good Friday are times
of decision. But for whom?

Not for Jesus, for the decision relative to His sacrifice and death had been made back at that fateful time when man had divorced himself from God through the falling prey to temptation and sin. The crucifixion and death of Jesus was foreordained of God, even as was His In carnation, His birth, into the life of man. God desired man to have the opportunity for renewed fellowship with Him, and the only way this could be accomplished was thru the giving of God Himself in the person of the Christ to the worst that sin could do to man, which is eath and suffering, that He might ponquor this worst of sin, and thru the Resurrection, might give to man a new chance for fellowship and sal vation. No, it was not a time of decision for the Lord.

Historically it was a time of de

for Peter and the disciples, who had to choose between remaining true, or denying the Master and running away in fear. We are

aware of their decision;

for Judas, who had the big de-cision of believing Christ to be God or just a reticent national savior who might be forced by arrest to show his real strength. We know the decision of Judas;

for Pilate, who had to decide whether he would be man or mouse, swayed by political and personal winds to make decisions he did not want to make. We know his de cision.

Lent and Good Friday and Easter are also times of decision for you and me - -

a decision as to the seriousness of your faith. Down 'deep in side, how serious are you concern ing your faith in our Lord-and Master? Is it an invaluable aspect of your living, or is it a part of living you can take or leave as the mood of the day may be? Jesus died for your sins, what is your decision about Him?

a decision as to whether you are to bear evidence of this your faith. Presuming it is important to you, what do you do about tell ing someone else about your Jesus As the disciples went forth after Pentecost to tell others, so modern Christians ought to do;

a decision relative to Christianity and our world. If Jesus is the answer for individual prob lems of salvation, then He also should be the answer for the prob lems of a world. But to be the answer, His principles must be made explicit in our thinking and actions, that we take our Christian principles with us into the market place and voting booth.

We are creatures of decision, al ways making choices of mind and act ion. Lent, Good Friday and Easterpresent for us opportunities to use this time of decision in behalf of the Lord, our personal salvation, and the salvation of the world.
