PUTTING FAITH INTO ACTION IN THE FAMILY

May, the month which includes the Festival of the Christian Home, also known as Mother's Day, is devoted to emphasis on the Christian family. Especially do we take cognizance of the family in the first full week, May 6 to 13, which is known as National Family Week.

In these days of divisive forces which prey upon our family solidarity, destroying family unity rather than augmenting it, it is doubly important that we pay attention to our family, making it strong in its unity and power over the individual members. For, the home remains a-mong the first forces in the determination of human personality and of strength of character on the part of its members. Though the church is a chief source of the teachings of the Christian faith, it is in the home where these teach ings are illustrated and given body and meaning. The spirit that is resident within your family, the manner in which the name of God is revered and the Holy Scriptures used, these are of tremendous impor tance in the molding of the person-

ality of family members. Further the home, in the kind of family life it engenders, the solidarity of the family, the importance of the family circle in the life and mind of its members, can be and is a stabilizing influence in the community. In these days of increasing unrest brought about by neighborhood gangs, and the concern of the police for the safety of the neighborhood, it is still a responsibility of the home to so 'train a youth in the say he should go' that he or she will not be so easily be led astray by the perverted thrill of 'glue-snifting' or 'joy pills,' which can lead to more serious perversions in individual life and direct calamity to neighborhood folk and community serenity. The family does not remain force ful in its influence upon its members automatically. It must be worked at. Let's look at the family of which we are a part, let us study the situation as it pertains to us and our neighborhood. Let us permit our faith and our participation in the total life of the United Evangelical Church to assist us in this job which is before us.
