We shall give thought to the theme in both services, and in the 10:15 service, the staff of our Church School will publicly reconsecrate themselves anew to a new year of activity in the art of teaching Gods Word.

May we repeat the information concerning Confirmation instruction, as appeared in the June issue:

l. The first session will be on Saturday, Sept. 15 at 9 a.m. in Friendship Hall. Unless other wise arranged, all sessions will be on Saturday mornings.

2. Parents entering children should contact the Pastor before the opening day. This can be accomplished by phone or in person. 3. It is a one'year course, though this year there may be sev eral completing the former choice of a two-year plan.

4. Confirmation leads to membership with this church, United Church, and no parent should enroll a young man or woman whom the parent does not desire to remain constant with the church after Confirmation as an active member.

5. Class members should either be entering 8th grade this Sept., or have attained the age of 13 to be eligible for registration. 6. The cost of materials will
