# WHAT OF OUR STEWARDSHIP?

Do you know what Stewardship is? It is the manner of our accounting unto God through the giving of our time, talent and treasures unto Him through His Church. God has given us all things, we are stewards unto Him. Stewardship is the accounting

of our use of His gifts.

Stewardship has to do with the self-education of ourselves through our loyalty to God's Cause in the fellowship of His Church. Very often when we hear the word "Stewardship' we think only of the giving of money. It has to do with a much larger concept, but it does also in a specific manner speak to us as regards our undergirding of God's own Cause here at home and the world over through our weekly gifts.

As another year approaches its ending, we in the church think already of 1963 and its needs. Already the finance committee is securing from all committees and groups the budgetary requests for the months a head, so the budget can be accurately arrived at. Already the office staff is beginning to think about getting the 1963 sets of envelopes ready for distribution in early Dec

And we will be thinking of the spiritual concept of Stewardship in the services of the first three Sun days in November - desiring to consider together very precisely on these Sundays of such questions as—0f what does active church member ship consist; who is a member of the church; how is membership maintained, or, is Confirmation enough; can one be a non-contributing member without having envelopes; is participation in the Church School sufficient; what does membership de mand of the individual; what are the needs of the church in terms of

money and jobs to be done, and how can each member fit in; what is the program of the church here at home and around the world?

These and other down-to-earth in quiries will be answered in these services. Come and hear. Come and understand. Come and be inspired. Be very regular in your presence in God's House.

The Church Council has set asise this special offering of the year, and sincerely requests you to give most generously to complete this job befor us. Most churches have success fully met this asking. We can too, but it will mean a real 'outgoing' offering. Any amount you give will be appreciated, but we will need a large number of gifts of \$10.00 or more and several generous gifts of \$50.00 or more to meet this need. The pastor was told when coming to United Church that the folk here always meet a real need without any coaxing. He is hoping to see a dem onstration of this at this point.
