THE YOUNGER GENERATION

It is thrilling to see a goodly number of our couples with small babies in attendance at the morning services, many of them sitting in the little room off the side of the sanctuary, called the "Baby" or "Quiet" Room, where the parents can participate in the services, as the service is brought to the room by special speaker. Also they can see the service through the large glass wall. But if the children are nois y, it does not affect the congregation, for the room is soundproof.

Further an air-conditioner has recently been installed in the room

so it is always comfortable.

Recently an added inovation has been provided in the hallway outside the room and right next to the washroom. A movable shelf has been installed which can be used as a "changing table" for very small children.

We are continually making every effort to urge family groups - parents and children - to be in the church services, and with these additions, make it possible for folks

with very young children to be here regularly also. Not even young children or even babes in arms need prevent you from attendance at

God's House regularly.

A further bit of news about our younger generation concerns the reinauguration of our 'Cradle Roll' here at the church. We invite all parents of the young to enter their children on the Cradle Roll. After the baptism of the child we automatically place that child on the Cradle Roll, and through our new Cradle Roll secretary, Mrs. Charles Clapin, special materials and birth day cards are sent the child until the age of 3, when the child is to be entered formally as a member of the Nursery of our Sunday Church School and brought to Church School each Sunday thereafter. If your pre-3 child is not on our Cradle Roll, call the Pastor and the ltle one will be so entered.
