The Wednesday evening service on April 7th at 8 p.m. features the an nual dramatic presentation of 'The Lord's Supper' by men of the church

There is no sermon this night and no Fellowship hour. This dramatic service is very unusual and meaning ful. Tell your friends about it and

Thursday - Maundy Thursday, Ap-Thursday - Maundy Thursday, April 8th - gives us the opportunity to participate in the service of Tenebrae, 'the lowering of lights.' This is a traditional service, with out sermon, wherein by Scripture and Hymn the lights in the sanctuary and on the altar are extinguish ed gradually. The service ends with the draping of the Cross, sign ifying the death of Jesus, and the benediction in darkness. Preceeding the service of Tenebrae we shall observe the Sacrament of Holy shall observe the Sacrament of Holy Communion.



GOOD FRIDAY APRIL 9TH

We provide a service of Communion and preaching here at 9 a.m. Pastor Weisser will be occupying the pulpit for this service.

The community 3 hr. Good Friday service will be here at United, beginning at 12 p.m. and lasting until 3 p.m. Pastor Rasche will have the opening service and the pastors of surrounding churches will preach on the 7 Words of Christ from the Cross. Choirs and choral groups of these churches will participate. You are invited to attend for the 3 hrs or for as many of the 7 periods as

possible.

Note: The evening service on Good Friday has been discontinued.



On Easter we have two identical services, the first at 6 a.m. and the second at 10 a.m. Only at the 10 a.m. service will we have the Easter Lily Memorial Service. Each

service will include the special Easter music by our choirs and the Easter message by Pastor Rasche. At each service the Sacrament of Holy Communion will be celebrated but with this difference. The communion service will be after the conclusion of the regular service. The Confirmation class will receive Com munion at the 10 a.m. service.
