MAY SUNDAYS

Our services continue at the hours of 8:00 and 10:15, save for the early Communion service at 7:45 on the first Sunday.

Through the Sundays of May, the Pastor continues the series of post Easter messages on "Our Morality," bringing into consideration our morality in the business world; in our family circle; in the area of youth and in our personal life. For Pentecost, the Pentecost theme will be expressed.

Sunday, May 2 is our Communion Day, with the early service at 7:45 a.m.

Sunday, May 9 is Mother's Day, also the Festival of the Christian Home. This is the traditional day on which we urge family members to come as a group to the service and to sit together. This is a perfect way to both honor a living mother or to memorialize a departed loved one and at the same time to hold sacred the great truth that families ought to worship together.

Sunday, May 30 is Pentecost, the close of the post-Easter season, the day of the Holy Spirit, the 3rd Person in the Holy Trinity, and the birthday of the Christian Church. Combined with this theme will be that of patriotism, for this is the Sunday next to Memorial Day. Be in God's House each and every Sunday, for this is our duty as disciples of our Lord and our God.
