Remember, also, that we maintain a Nursery during the 10:15 service for children from walking stage up to age 5. Attendant in charge.




### SEPT. 19 98TH ANNIVERSARY

### CONFIRMATION CLASSES TO BE ORGANIZED

Confirmation instruction at Unit ed is now on a two-year basis, with youth in the 7th grade or 12 yrs of age eligible for the first yr.class and membership in the second year class limited only to those who completed the first year course. All others, though they be 13 or older, must fulfill the two year requirement.

The first year class meets on Sunday mornings at the 9 a.m. hour (as a part of the Church School, but definitely a class in Confirmation instruction, with very regular attendance required and home work demanded) All who are in 7th grade or 12 yrs of age are invited to become a part of this class, which is to be organized on Sunday, Sept. 12 at 9 a.m. in Friendship Hall(the basement under the church) Mrs. May Getz, last year's teacher, will again take responsibility for this class, under the direction of the Pastor.

The second year class (last years lst yr class) will meet for the first time with Pastor Rasche on Thurs., Sept. 16 at 7:30 p.m. in Friendship Hall, the session to con clude at 9 p.m. Each Thursday there after the class will be in session at the same hours.
