The mother help ed to teach him Braille and he began to read the New Testament. The ninth chapter of John with the story of the blind man and Jesus spoke to this young man in his condition. He remembered Jesus saying that the man's blindness was to be the avenue of God's speaking to and in him.

The young Japanese grew in faith and decided that he had a mission to work out in his life. He went to college, later studying at the Univ

sity of Edinburgh. He became a college professor and manifested his faith in the life of activity, giving to the world the benefit of his keen mind.

The road from self destruction to a professorship was the road of faith, the faith of a mother and then the growth of a faith in the son, each one "according to his

faith."

What of the expression of your faith, not just at the time of the Sacrament but in all avenues of your life? Jesus truly expects each of us to fully live our life according to our faith and to be constantly concerned in the further growth of that faith through a constancy in Bible reading, prayer and association in worship at God's church.

Your life needs to be lived "according to your faith."
