READ THE GOSPELS

One of the chief thrusts of that program known as Key 73 is to concentrate upon the reading of the Bible, especially the gospels, in the period of 1973 until Easter. In many places copies of the Scripture are being distributed house to house. Bible study groups are being set up in neighborhoods and in churches.

All this is necessary. For the I for the Bible is great. Never before have people been beset on every hand with influences and forces which are so distracting and contradictory. It takes a conscious effort, a real battle, to get through the day with anything at all of your own planning. By night we have several times fallen short of our ideals.

With so many voices calling, we need to hear the voice of Christ calling - clearly, plainly. We need both the inspiration and the quieting that comes from listening to His voice.

No better way is possible to secure this blessing than to read the Gospels - Matthew, Mark, Luke, John. Read all the gospels. There are only 89 chapters in the 4 books. Make this your goal for February - to read 3 chapters a day, as an individual or as a family. You will

discover that you would be able to complete the 4 books in an ordinary month, but since February is a short month you may use the first several days of March.

This plan is recommended for trial to all those who are not now reading the Bible seriously and regularly. Or it may be an addition to daily readings, such as in the Upper Room, for instance.

Whatever the problems may be, whatever temptation we meet, whatever danger we face, this plan is recommended to give us determination to learn His will for each of us and then courage to do it.



SUNDAYS IN FEBRUARY

With February we bring to a close the series of meditations on the Book of Revelation, which began in September and was interrupted for Advent and Christmas. In all we will have had 18 such messages, an experience which, I'm sure, has been as helpful to the congregation as it has to the Pastor.

In February we also begin the Pre-Lenten period of the Church Year, a period which includes three Sundays and concludes with Ash Wednesday, on Wednesday, March 7. Be with us on each Sunday, for each Sunday is an important Lord's Day. Let not our 'connection' with God

grow so lax that we fail to be in His House each Lord's Day.


