



'ASSOCIATE' PASTOR EXTENDED 'CALL'.

On Sunday, May 12, at a special congregational meeting, the people of United voted affirmatively to tend a 'call' to Mrs. Mary Ellen tchen to become the full-time associate' Pastor of our Church, to assist and work with Pastor Ras che in the total work of the pastorate. If Mrs. Kitchen accepts the 'Call' or contract which the Church Council extends to her, she will assume the work here about or before July 1 of this year.

Mrs. Kitchen is a recent theological graduate of the Pacific School of Religion in California, a theological seminary with relation to our denomination. According to the rules of the denomination, a graduate to the Christian ministry must receive a 'Call' from a local congregation before Ordination to the Christian ministry can be accorded. Following that an instrument of Installation to a local pastorate can be drawn up by the Association of the United Church of Christ to which that local church

belongs, in our case the Chesapeake Association of the Central Atlantic Conference. Upon installation, the position of 'standing' in that Association can then be bestowed upon the individual Pastor.

Mrs. Kitchen will then be known as Pastor Kitchen. She and her husband will find residence in Baltimore. Her husband will be working full-time in a Theological School in Washington, D.C. on his Doctorate in Semitic languages. He has begun his theological work and has been serving as Pastor to 4 churches in western Md., which position he concludes at the end of May.



PENTECOST BRINGS OUR SUMMER COMMUNION

In the services at 7:45 and 10:15 a.m. on Sunday, June 2, we shall gather at the altar for our last Communion service until Sunday, Sept. 8th. We urge all members to present themselves before God's altar for the Sacrament on

this occasion.

Pastor Rasche will be preaching on the Biblical account of the Christian observance of Pentecost. This is the 'day of the Holy Spirit,' the coming of the Spirit of the Lord God in power upon the first disciples and the children of God since then. Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian Church.

On this day we also are invited to bring a special offering for our Theological Seminaries. In two such offerings in'74 we are endeavoring to bring special aid to our two schools (Eden Seminary in Missouri and Lancaster Seminary in Lan caster, Pa.) which are endeavoring to train young men and women for the pastoral work in our church. Though not our only theological schools, these two are those which are closest to our hearts and thus our support. May we share in this special offering.



SERVICES HELD REGULARLY DURING SUMMER MONTHS

The services of the church and the sessions of the Church School continue through all months of the year at the regular hours. Thus, each Sunday we shall gather for Divine Worship at the hour of 8:00 and 10:15(10:30 on last Sunday) and the Sunday Church School begins at 9 a.m.

VISITATIONS BEING MADE


