

Pastor Kasche

The regular meeting of the Council Board of the United Evangelical Church was held on April 4, 1967.

Those in attendance were Albert Fader, George Sauer, Arthur Block, William Single, III, Richard Single, Ernest Jones, Louis Mueller, Louis Smith and Louis Charles Jr.

The meeting was called to order by President Albert Fader. Pastor Kasche was ill and was not able to be with us.

The minutes for the meeting of the month of March were read and approved as written.

Report of Committees:

Finance Committee: In reviewing the monthly Financial Report it was noted that the fuel oil bills for heating the parsonage were running rather high. Richard Single said that he would bring a heating engineer in to make a survey of our entire heating plants. Mr. Single informs us that this survey would not cost us anything as this engineer works with him.

The Finance Committee at their last meeting decided to merge the Emergency Fund and the General Fund into one entry on the monthly Financial Report. They feel this will make the report simpler to maintain and easier to understand.

Property Committee: The Church school wall has been painted up as per contract.

Hayes & Sons have looked into our acoustics problem in the Church and have recommended the following: more voices in the choir, graduated steps in the choir loft, and the addition of microphones with amplifiers. The Council Board

agreed to take one step at a time, and for the time being take the plug in microphone at the Altar and set it up in front of the Choir.

Mr. Evans was contacted in regards to modifying the organ. He has suggested adding additional stops at a cost of \$650.00, and adding 183 pipes which would cost \$2370.00. For more particulars on the modification of the organ I refer you to the estimate from Mr. Evans.

George Sauer reports that the planter work in front of the parsonage will commence with the coming of good weather.

Louis Smith assures us that the worn Altar carpeting will be repaired free of charge.

The Council Board noted that the plumbing repair work was satisfactorily completed.

Mr. Fader informed us that our mimeograph machine was in very poor condition and that money had been budgeted for the

purchase of a new machine. He spoke favorably of the A B Dick machine which he said would handle 500 sheets of paper as opposed to 100 sheets which our present machine handles. Mr. Fader thought this machine could be bought for approximately \$750.00. Richard Single made a motion we purchase this article providing the price does not exceed \$800.00. The motion was seconded by William Single III and was unanimously carried.

William Single put this question to the Council ~~On~~ Do we need new front doors for the Church and if we ~~do~~<sup>not</sup> would we want them to be made of glass? The Council Board agreed ~~that~~<sup>the</sup> the present doors were all right and that there were many other things we needed more than new doors. George Bauer said we need weather stripping of some kind on the front Church doors.

Richard Single suggested we compile a list of things we need for the church and set them up for those who wish to offer memorials.

Finance Committee: The Finance Committee held a meeting Feb. 21 with Carter Locke attending and two recommendations to the Council Board were forthcoming. The committee recommends that the outstanding bonds for the Church School Innovation project be declared unredeemable until maturity; the only exception to this rule would be in the case of an emergency.

The other recommendation was the merger of the Memorial Fund with Gifts and Requests. The combined fund would then be listed as the Memorial Fund, and the money would be placed in one savings institution.

By so doing, the committee feels the book-keeping will be made simpler and the monthly financial report will be easier to decipher.

The Council Board approved Richard's request to contact the insurance company to acquire this blanket coverage.

The Council Board is well aware of the time consuming job of bookkeeping that Ernest Jones is doing and wanted to compensate him for it. Ernest refused the compensation and said that he would like to have a new adding machine which would save him time.

William Doehler made a motion we purchase an adding machine for Mr. Jones. Louis Smith seconded the motion - it was unanimously carried.

New Business: Mr. Fader urged the Council Board members to turn out for the Chicken Supper April 12 - lots of help needed - start 5 o'clock. Permission granted to Mrs. Fader to write away for quotes for 1968 envelopes.

Albert Fader informed the Council Board of Baster Locke's request to eliminate the service on Good Friday evening. The Council Board voted unanimously in disfavor of this request.

This year 5 churches will participate in the  
Community Vacation Bible School. Mr. Fader  
tells us the formal plans are working  
out rather well and it appears to be a  
good community venture in the making.

As there was no other business to come before  
the Council Board at this time a motion  
was made by Richard Single and seconded  
by William Single that the meeting be  
adjourned. The meeting was closed with  
the Lords Prayer.
