

The regular meeting of the Council Board of the United Evangelical Church was held on April 2, 1968.

The meeting was called to order by President Albert Fader and the meeting was opened with a prayer by Pastor Paul A. Kasche.

The minutes for the meeting for the month of March were read and approved as written.

The monthly financial report was reviewed and approved as submitted.

Report of Committees:

Finance Committee: Progress

Property Committee: George Sauer reported the following on the Church property:

The rest room damage has all been taken care of.

Tables for Friendship Hall will cost \$45.00 each; this would be a table 3' x 8' x 3/4" thick plywood covered with formica.

carried.

return tomorrow and give a complete appraisal.

bought to complete this job.
