

## Special Meeting of the United Evangelical Council Board

Our president, Albert Fader, called a special meeting of the Council Board, June 19, 1967. The purpose was to discuss the proposed Constitution of the Canton Christian Council.

The meeting was called to order by President Albert Fader, and the meeting was opened with a prayer by Pastor Rasche.

Those in attendance were William Bark Jr., Ernest Jones, Albert Fader, William Voelker, Louis Mueller, Louis Smith, Albert Johnson, William Single III, Arthur Block, and Louis Parker Sr.

The Council Board did not ratify the proposed Constitution of the Canton Christian Council at the regular June meeting. The chief reason being the lack of specifics where financial commitments were concerned. Pastor Rasche, Paul Bauersfeld, and Albert Fader, our trustees representing us at the Canton Christian Council, supplied the following estimates: wall paneling, tile on floor, additional electrical receptacles, pipes and plumbing - \$1,000.00. Heat would cost \$300.00 a year, Electric bills \$200.00 a year, insurance \$150.00 a year for a total of \$1650.00 a year. The Council Board still looked on these as approximate figures and wanted something more definite in the way of financial commitments. The point was also brought up that the inspection prior to the issuance of insurance on the property may uncover major faults which would be costly to repair. With items of this nature still standing open it was decided to send our trustees to the next meeting with the resolution we adopted at the June meeting.

Old Business: We are looking for a formal report of some kind on Pastor's exchange with Minister from England. It will cost United Evangelical Church nothing extra in salaries as Pastor Rasche and Minister from England will split their salaries. Pastor Rasche asked for six weeks vacation next year so that he could spend two weeks on the Continent after the London exchange period. He said he would take only two weeks this year, thus saving two weeks for next year. The Council Board did not approve the six weeks; the thought was that this was too long of a period in one stretch without a Pastor. The Council Board approved the four week plan with a wait and see attitude about the other two weeks, as we still have some six months before specifics are required.

There being no other business to come before the Board at this time the meeting was adjourned.
