"The United Evangelical Church, East Avenue and Dillon St. will present "The Last Supper Tableau" on Wednesday, April 7 at 8:00 p.m.

Living figures, dressed according to biblical times, represent the disciples of the Lord gathered about the table of Holy Communion. In several dramatic flashbacks, the story of each disciple is told along with the effect that the Lord Jesus Christ had on their life. Most spectacular is the reproduction of Divinci's masterpiece portrayed by the men of the church."

Other services of Holy Week include the Tenebrae Service at 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 8, depicting the story of Jesus' passion in scripture and song and bringing the gradual extinction of the candles at the altar and the sanctuary lights until the close of the service is in complete darkness. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will also be observed at this service.

Good Friday Service, April 9 begins at 9:00 a.m. and the Sacrament of Holy Communion will also be observed at this service.

Easter Sunday services will be at 6 and 10 a.m. followed by a breakfast brunch at 7:30 a.m. The Sacrament of Holy Communion will be observed at both of these services.
