When you have an emergency on the water....

Boating mishaps make great cocktail conversations (*Guess what happened on my vacation*) and terrific tabloid material (*Man loses mind, engine in freak boating incident*), but we can probably agree that emergency situations should be avoided.

Thorough preparation for an extended cruise can eliminate many instances where you would need assistance on the water -- double-checking the engine, tanks, and hoses to ensure proper operation, or stowing and securing extra batteries, plugs and tools for simple mechanical repairs. But despite preparation, you may find yourself in a situation where you need help.

First determine whether your circumstance is an emergency situation. The Coast Guard defines a distress as a situation where you or your boat is threatened by grave or imminent danger requiring immediate assistance. In this case you use "Mayday, Mayday, Mayday" on the radio (Channel 16 VHF/FM and 2182 khz HF/SSB are monitored by the Coast Guard). If you do not have
