A man said, "The people who built our forty yr. old house put in a good, solid foundation, under most of it. But they seem to have forgotten the porch. Each year I've watched the porch sag more and more. Now it has reached the point where I can ignore it no longer. I've spent the last three evenings putting in props, tearing away the rotten wood, preparatory to laying a concrete foundation.

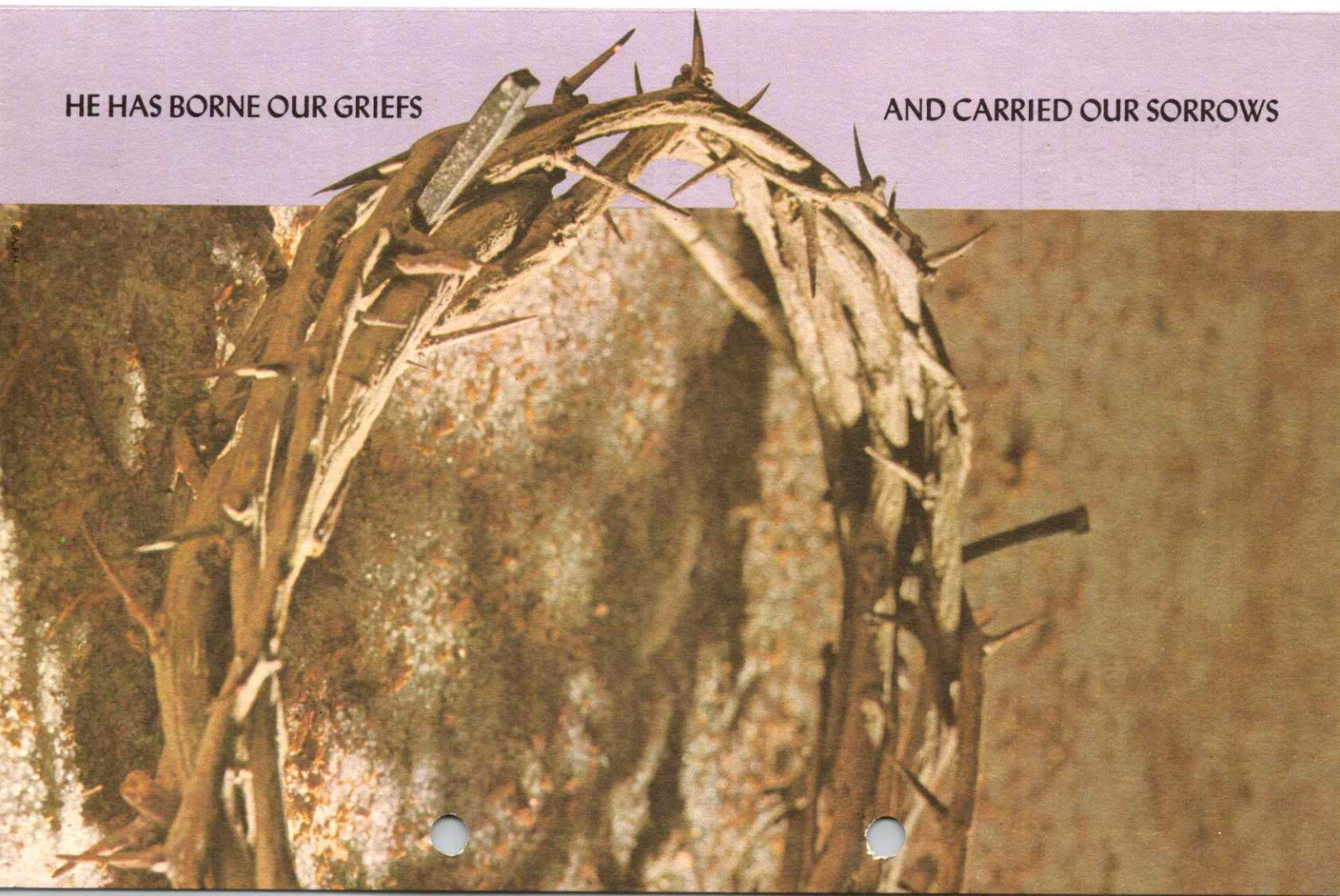
Jesus suggests that our lives are like houses. Those with firm foundations will stand through time and storm. Those without will crumble in a moment of stress.

For the most of us, the situation is somewhere inbetween these two extremes. There are 'sagging front porches; in our reasonably stable lives, weak spots where our supports aren't as firm as they might be. Some of us are solid as rock in our business ethics, but we have a way of failing in our personal face-to-face relationships. Or we are scrupulous in face-to-face relationships but completely heedless of the broader social issues of right and wrong.

It makes me wonder, as I work on my porch, where I ought to be building new foundations in my life. How about yours."

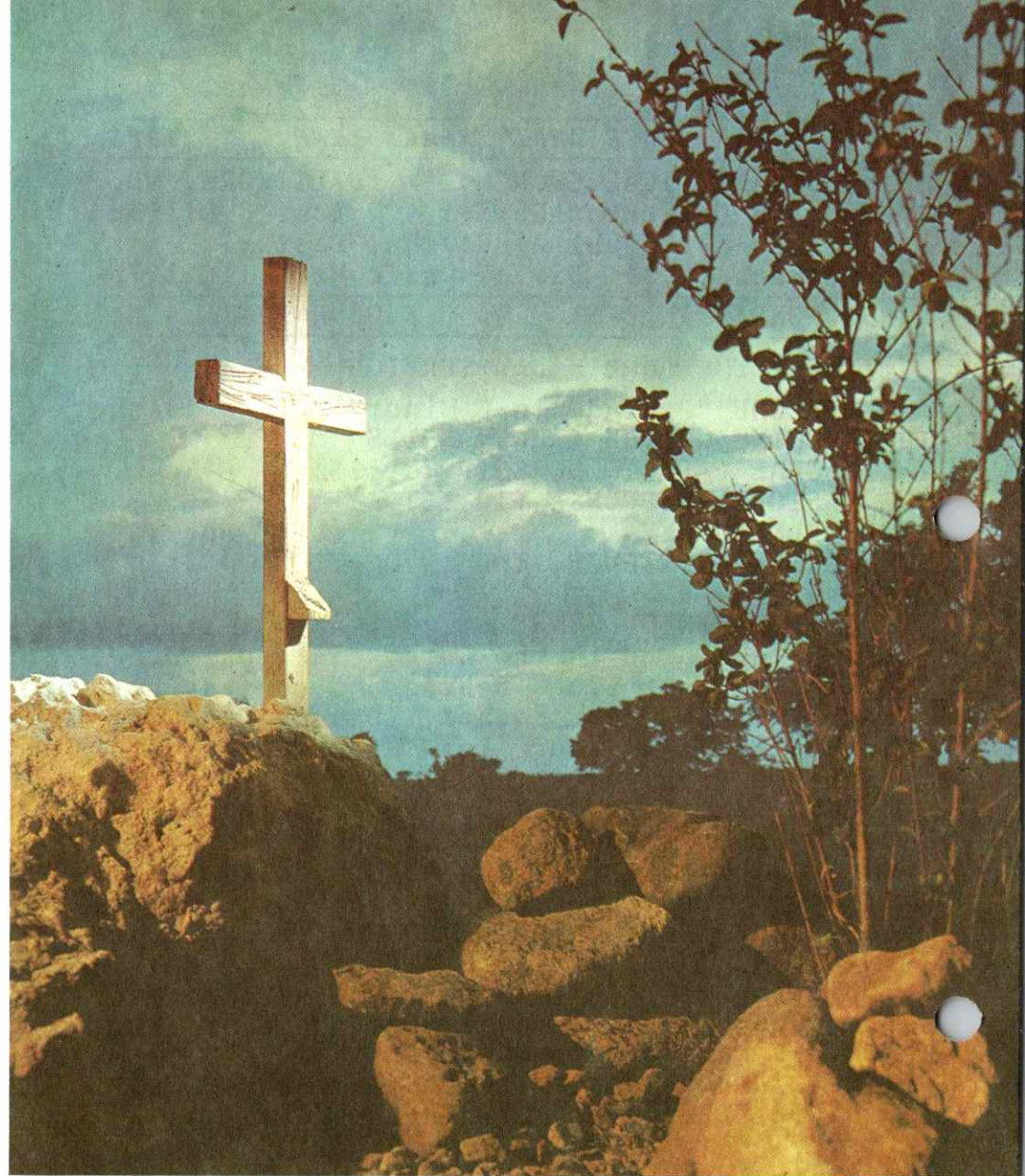

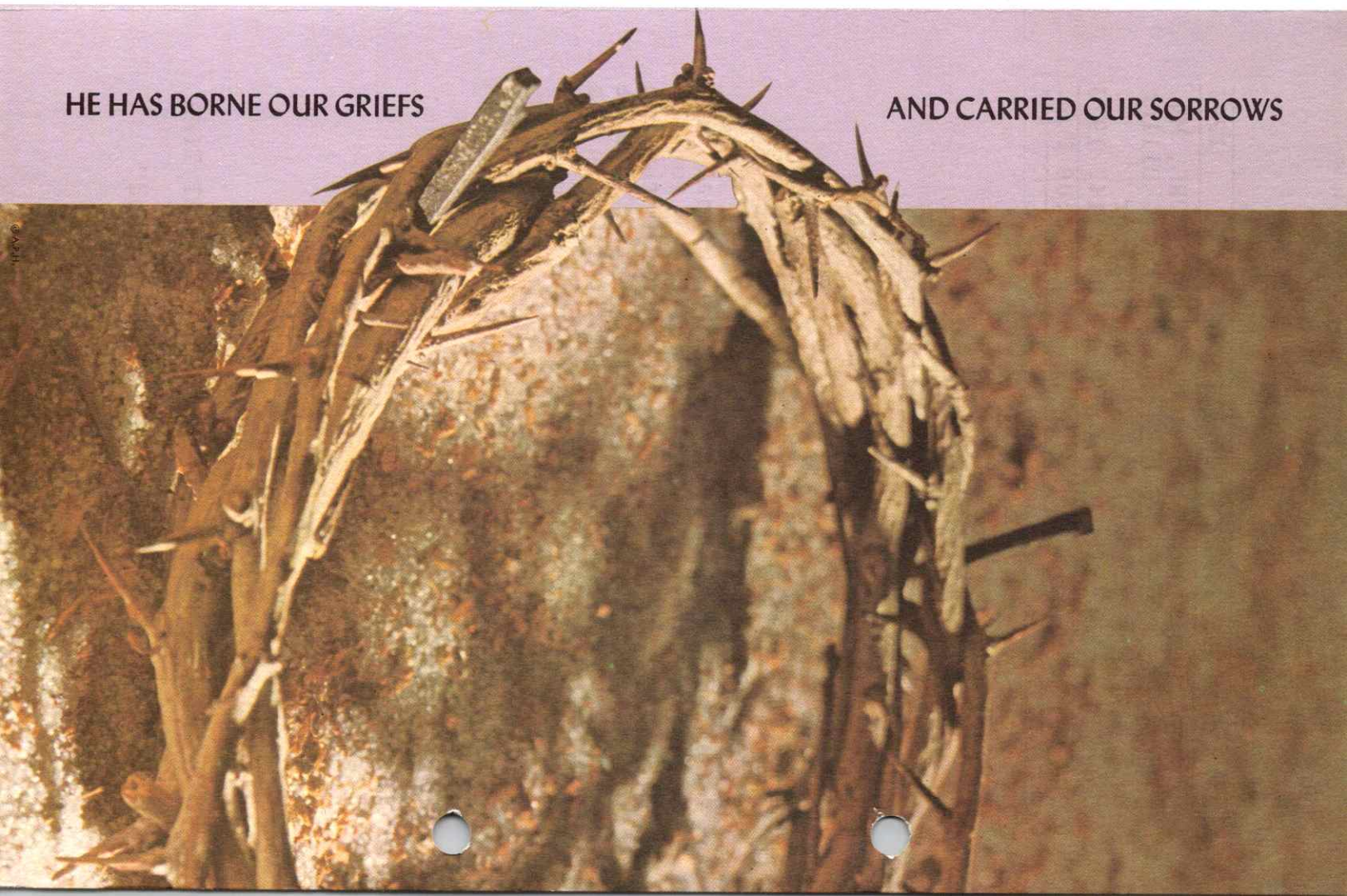

FOR YOUR MEDITATION

"It strikes me that Jesus was never very impressed with talk. He was more concerned with human lives.

When the Parissees tried to trip him up with intricate theological arguments, he seldom got involved beyond a terse, pointed answer, as though he were impatient with such debate and eager to be about his real work of demonstrating the love of God.

How do you suppose Jesus would react to our kind of Christianity? Sometimes I suspect that he would be skeptical of our lofty professions of faith.....unless, looking within our churches, he could also see the 'blind' (of spirit) had learned to see, and the 'lame' (in faith) who had been made to walk.

How would he feel about the Christianity that he sees in your life and mine? Somewhere within our reach are those who are lonely and unhappy and hurt, to whom we could bring a measure of healing. When I make professions of faith in Christ, I can almost hear him ask me, 'But, have you helped the blind to see and the lame to walk?'

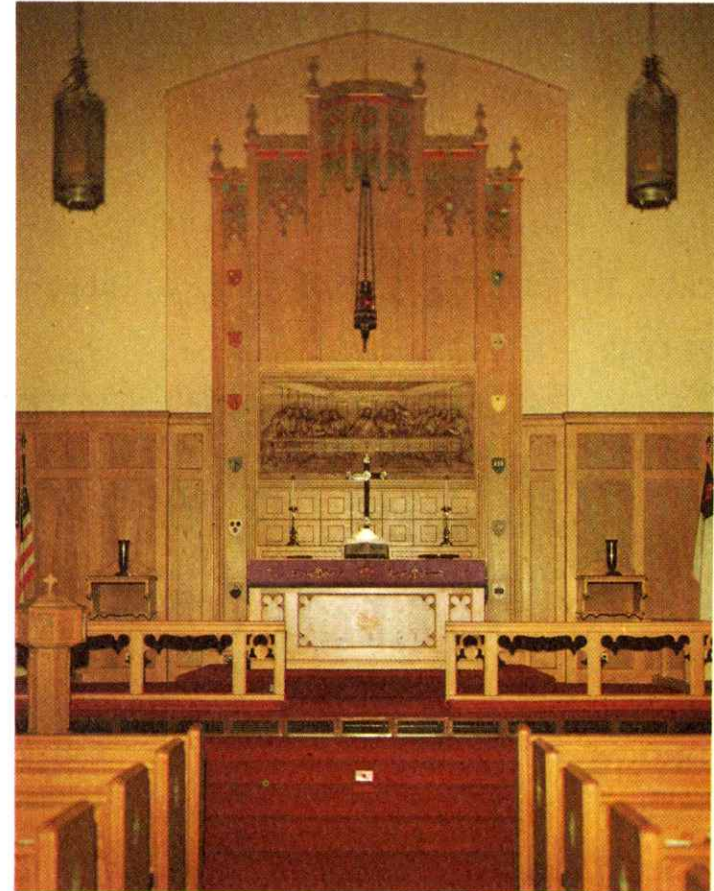

FOR YOUR MEDITATION

".... the most popular word in the English language these days must be 'priorities. 'Every organization....is setting new priorities. Sometimes it even gets inflated to 'the process of reprioritization. It means, simply said, deciding what is most important for that particular moment.

That's exactly what Jesus was doing when He healed the sick man on the Sabbath. Jesus believed in the sacredness of the Sabbath, but at that moment, a man's health was at stake, and that was more urgent. Indeed, in Jesus' life, compassion was always top priority.

We have to remind ourselves of that sometimes. What I'm hard at work on a project, it isn't easy to stop and shift gears in order to talk with someone who needs to talk just then. What I am bent on the demands of justice, it is sometimes difficult to see that, in this case, justice may need to be tempered with mercy.

"What's a Dollar?"

In days of inflation, rising costs and the devaluation of the dollar, everyone wants to know what his dollar can do.

Church World Service (CWS) in which we participate through our One Great Hour of Sharing offering has just released the dollar value for 1972. We know that our men will use our dollars just as expeditiously in 1973. Here is the stupendous story.

\$1 delivered \$19.13 worth of food to disaster victims. This is the equivalent of 327 lbs. of food. Donations of Food for Peace helped to stretch the total. While your dollar was shrinking at the supermarket, the OGHS dollar was doing better, for in 1971 the rate was only 300 lbs. for the dollar.

\$1 delivered 6.33 lbs. of clothing which had a value of \$6.57. When you think that some of this clothing was used for work clothing, then we can realize that it not only helped cloth people for everyday use, but as work clothing assisted in building hospitals, schools, etc. to help improve conditions around the world.

\$1 delivered \$59.32 worth of medical supplies for emergency disasters, and on-going hospital dispensary operations across a world.

\$1 delivered \$29.31 worth of self-help materials so that people who were in disaster area and war-torn places could help themselves make a new life.

Our participation in CWS made it possible for this agency to deliver \$12.1 millions in aid in 1972. Truly this is a multiplication of our dollars in a miraculous manner.

May we present our special gifts this OGHS Sunday with the knowledge that every dollar we contribute is miraculously increased in its power to help others in need. Thus we share in doing God's work today.
