

WHAT DOES OUR MONEY DO?

One dollar, when given to the wider mission of our United Church of Christ, will pay for the distribution of 250 pounds of food in an area struck by disaster, like flood or earthquake.

Five dollars will provide for the treatment of 50 persons at a mobile clinic in Vietnam. It will also pay for sending 50 lbs of clothing to a work project in a needy country.

Ten dollars will provide a month's education for a Tibetan refugee child. It will also deliver 100 lbs. of rice to impoverished Bangladesh farmers.

Twenty-five dollars will buy enough meat substitute for an average family for one year in many countries. It will also enable a planned parenthood clinic to counsel 20 families in many a country.

INTERIM PASTOR


