SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

CHURCH ATTENDANCE

Attendance for the five weeks in January was 27% over that in January 1994. This was due to better weather in 1995 in addition to seven baptisms and the reception of 14 new members.

PACT PROGRAM

The marketing program needs to be executed to recruit new children for the program.

DANCE CLASSES

We now have a 'hold harmless' agreement signed by Vanessa Johnson for her organization Turn-Out (see attached) and have received a letter of transmittal with the list of students in the classes.

CANTON ASSOCIATION OF RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERS MEETS WITH STATE VETERAN'S ADMINISTRATION REP

C.A.R.D.O is made up of responsible dog owners who are concerned about the use of the Canton Waterfront Park for their dogs. This association is made up of condo owners on the waterfront. On Tuesday January 10 they met with the Veteran's Administration Rep and local neighborhood people to discuss their concerns. Councilman John Cain was present along with 60 persons from the area. This was the first time persons from the Waterfront apartments have come to our church for any activity. They were impressed by the church plant and a few had the opportunity to see the church.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING RE LENTEN PROPOSAL

At our Congregational Meeting on January 29th, the members rejected the idea of a Soup and Bread Meal during Lent. They preferred a traditional service with the emphasis on the "Women Ancestors of Jesus" and half of them indicated their interest in a healing service. Therefore we are going to have a traditional service followed by a healing service for those who wish to stay (see attached description).

SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

CHURCH ATTENDANCE

Attendance for the four weeks in February was 16% over that in February 1994. This was due to better weather in 1995 since we lost one whole service in 1994 but also had bad weather the first Sunday in February 1995.

PACT PROGRAM

The marketing program is underway to recruit new children for the program.

DANCE CLASSES

A report on the Dance Classes is attached. A check has been received for the winter program of classes.

LENTEN PROGRAM

An ad was placed in the East Baltimore Guide announcing our Lenten Program (see attached) and the program was announced in the Endeavor. We will have a traditional service followed by a healing service for those who wish to stay. The Ash Wednesday Service will be held on Wednesday March 1, 1995 at 7:30PM. World Day of Prayer for Canton-Highlandtown will be held at United on Friday, March 3, 1995 at 11:00AM. Cass Young is the Chair of this service which will focus on the church in Ghana. The Rev. Sue Weber, Pastor of the Salem Methodist Church will deliver the Meditation. She was a missionary to Ghana prior to her current call. On Easter Sunday we will have our traditional building of the "Living Cross" at 9:30AM.

THINK TANK

On Tuesday, March 7, 1995, the Think Tank will meet at St. Brigid's at noon. The focus will be to plan the "Blessing of the Palms" on Palm Sunday at O'Donnel Square and to plan the "Procession of the Cross" on Good Friday Morning at 11:00AM at St. Brigid's. Pastor Rabaudo of the Abbott Memorial Church and Father Robert of St. Casimir's have indicated their willingness to attend. This will be a first for these churches. Carol Flanagan, Vicar of Holy Evangelists will bring us up to date on the future of that church.

SOUR BEEF DINNER

We had one of the most successful Spring Luncheons and Dinners in the recent history of the church. Art Jones and

George Hammerbacher were our Co-Chairs this year and will give a more detailed report in this meeting. Despite the fact that the East Baltimore Guide, due to their internal reorganization, did not print the announcement of the dinner we had about as many people as we could handle. As a church we are thankful to the Lord for this blessing.

MINISTER OF VISITATION GETS UNDERWAY

Following approval at our Congregational Meeting in January, The Rev. Roy Joellenbeck has begun his part-time ministry with us. This has been of great assistance to your Pastor. Our ability to meet the needs of Shut-In persons in the church has been greatly improved and is reflected in Roy's first report. I have spent some time in orienting him to the needs of our parish and developing a plan of ministry on Tuesday and Wednesday of each week. To give him visibility in our parish, Roy has been involved as liturgist when we celebrate the Lord's Supper beginning with the first Sunday in February and each first Sunday of the month thereafter. We have added his name to the masthead of our Bulletins and the Church sign. Bill Voelker has had business cards printed up for both Pastors so that we can make public Roy's home phone. Our Church School thru Carol Borkman has made up boxes which can be left with Shut-Ins along with a Church Bulletin. These remind Shut-Ins of our continuing concern for them and God's gracious love. They have been very effective especially for those with chronic disabilities. Roy will coordinate his work with the "Caring" letter produced by Grace Fader and the "Cards" which Priscilla regularly sends to Shut-Ins and those in the hospital.

BOY SCOUT SUNDAY

On February 19th, we celebrated Boy Scout Sunday. Scouts came with their leaders and marched in and posted their flags in the Church. Together they said the Scout Oath and Law and the leaders were recognized in our "Faith Alive" time for their contribution to character building with the boys. We also recognized Ed Meyers for his 60+ years in Scouting. On Friday, February 17th the Cub Scouts held their first Blue and Gold party celebration.

CHURCH SCHOOL TEACHING

On Sunday, February 12th, at 9:30AM in the Church we held our Winter Teaching. It was focused on the theme "Come Along with Jesus" and on Jesus call to his disciples to go and preach the gospel. We reviewed the story of Jesus' call to us to become "fishers of men". Each child was given a fish and a map with a real net and a boat was used to show Jesus call from a boat and which led the disciples to leave their nets and to become fishers of people. Three teachers were asked to tell the children why they followed Jesus and Miss Ella came and shared her commitment with the children.

APRIL 1, 1995 - APRIL 30, 1995

SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

CHURCH ATTENDANCE

Attendance for the four weeks in April was 9% over that in April 1994. This was due to the substantial increase in Palm Sunday and Easter attendance and that for the Tableau.

PACT PROGRAM

The Lead Abatement program is almost completed. The Licensing Division of the State has been notified of our progress so that we would not lose our position as a qualifying organization. The recruitment program is continuing and resulted in the addition of five children for the fall. Ads and community service announcements have been placed in the East Baltimore Guide, The Dundalk Eagle, and the Harbor Crescent.

NEW MEMBERS

On Palm Sunday, April 9th, we received four more new adult members and six confirmands. On Sunday April 30th we received two more new members. This makes a total of 26 new members since January 1995.

THINK TANK

On Sunday, April 23rd we attended the final closing services for the Holy Evangelists Church. While the English speaking church closed on that day, the Spanish Congregation will continue into the fall of 1995. President Hammerbacher sent a letter on behalf of our church to Holy Evangelists expressing our sorrow at the closing and our support of the ministry of Vicar Carol Flannagan.

The "Blessing of the Palms" went very well. Attendance was the largest in the last five years. Father Robert, the new priest of St. Casimir's attended with members of his church. Attendance at the "Procession of the Cross" was smaller due to the cold weather. Six churches participated in this event.

PROGRESS OF THE PASTORAL MINISTRY

During Lent Pastor Joellenbeck and I have undertaken the task of serving communion to as many shut-ins as possible. Our activity is reported in the statistical section of this report. Pastor Joellenbeck made visits and calls. I made 14 visits and 14 calls for a total of 28 visits and calls. Together we made 40 visits. During March I also made 2 hospital visits, celebrated 1 marriage, and 1 funeral.

SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

2. Complete Record Retention Policy for Review and Approval by the Council. John Price is working now on computerizing our record system.

3. At our last meeting, the approval of the policy for guiding our relationships (especially dealing with abuse and harassment) was deferred until we prepare our new Constitution.

4. I received a letter from Calvin Gundlach requesting that we ask the Council to extend another invitation to Pat Kelly to come back again next year. In addition he requests that we change our Council meeting on May 2nd to allow members of the Council and Church and me as Pastor to join Pat Kelly at the Baltimore arena to help plan his fall Crusade.

In preparation for your confirmation exam, you will be expected to recite the Lord's Prayer, The Ten Commandments (page 78 of your book "My Confirmation"), the Apostles Creed, and to prepare a written Statement of Faith which you will read to the examination board. This statement must be prepared in clearly legible handwriting or may be typed. It must be titled "MY STATEMENT OF FAITH" and be dated and carry your signature (see suggestions attached). In addition, you will be asked to respond to the questions which we have gone over and which are attached to this letter. These assignments will be reviewed by an examining board of three members of our Council on Thursday April 6 at 7:30PM. They will decide if you pass or fail. I must tell you, we are very strict about your meeting these minimum requirements. Let me know if you have any questions about this assignment.

Your confirmation class picture and your individual picture will be taken on Thursday, April 6th at 7:00PM. The price for these pictures will be \$10.00. Please come dressed for your picture. You will have a confirmation gown which will need to be pressed to prepare for this picture. You can pick up your gown at the office on Thursday, March 30th or at the Wednesday service on March 29th. Rental of the confirmation gown will \$8.00. Your total cost for confirmation will be \$18.00 for the pictures and gown. Please have your fees ready when you pick up your gown. Let me know if you have trouble meeting this expense.

Confirmation will take place on Palm Sunday, April 9th. We will meet at the church at 9:00AM and march to O'Donnell Square for the Blessing of the Palms and then return to the church for Confirmation.

On Good Friday, April 1, following the Good Friday service at 9:00AM we will go to St. Brigid's for the Procession of the Cross at 10:30AM.

Confirmands will take Communion on Easter Sunday, April 16th at the 10:00AM Service. We will march into the church together. Please wear your Confirmation gown for this service.

MY STATEMENT OF FAITH

A Statement of Faith is a summary of what you believe. It is your belief about life and is like a creed. Your statement does not have to be long. As you remember, the first creed of the church was short. It was "JESUS IS LORD." One hundred years after Jesus the statement of faith of the church was more complicated. It was the Apostle's Creed.

Even though the first creed of the church was short, Christians knew what it meant. Jesus was the person they followed in all things. He taught them what love was, he taught them to feed the hungry, heal the sick, care for all living things, and taught them the meaning of forgiveness.

When you write your statement be sure to say what your faith means to you. What difference does it make when you go to school or church? What difference does it make when you are tempted to hurt your enemies or are asked to help your friends.

Some things the Christian faith has meant to people.

1. The song Jesus Loves Me expresses some of this. Do you remember it? "Jesus loves me this I know. For the bible tells me so. Little ones to him belong. They are weak but he is strong. Yes Jesus loves me, the bible tells me so". If you believe these words you go to school knowing God loves you and walks with you each day even when you are afraid. You are God's special child.

2. Remember the song "Be they yellow, black or white, they are precious in his sight. Jesus loves the little children of the world". What does the Christian faith teach you about your love for people in your school who are different from you?

3. Jesus healed the sick. When he lived the sick were thought to be being punished by God. Because Jesus healed them he showed that God's will for them and for us is health, wholeness, and the abundant life. God wants us well.

4. Jesus told us to visit those in prison. Would you do that for someone you know in prison?

What does the word salvation mean?

Ans. Life with God

What does the word sin mean?

Ans. Separation from God

What story tells about salvation in the Old Testament?

Ans. The story of God's saving the Hebrew people from slavery in Egypt and leading them to freedom in the promised land - Israel. (Book of Exodus) God is the Lord of History.

What story tells us about salvation in the New Testament?

Ans. The story of God's saving love in the work of Jesus. Jesus led us from slavery to the law to freedom in the eternal life. (John 3:16)

What does the word bible mean?

Ans. "little books". The bible is a library of "little books".

How many books are in the Old Testament?

Ans. 39 books

How many books are in the New Testament?

Ans. 27 books

How many books are in the bible?

Ans. 66 books

What is the first book of the Old Testament?

Ans. Genesis

What does the word Genesis mean?

Ans. "the story of the beginning"

What is the first line of Bible?

Ans. "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth."

Who is Jesus?

Ans. God in the flesh.

Where can you find a good description of Jesus in the bible?

Ans. "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God". John 1:1-5

What is a sacrament?

Ans. A drama of God's relationship with us.

What are the sacraments of the church?

Ans. Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

Why are these sacraments?

Ans. Because Jesus participated in baptism with John the Baptist and because Jesus taught us to celebrate the Lord's Supper in remembrance of him. (Baptism Mark 1:4-10; Lord's Supper Matt 26:26-29)

What is a confirmand?

Ans. One who has received the Holy Spirit and becomes a member of the church. (Acts 8:14:25) Note Acts 8:16-17

What happens in baptism?

Ans. An infant is received into the household of faith and is marked with the sign of the cross. Parents promise to raise the child in the knowledge and love of the Lord. An adult is received into membership in the church.

What happens in the Lord's Supper?

Ans. We receive bread (His body) and wine (His blood) in remembrance that Christ died for our sins. We are Christ's living body and blood.

What is the Solemn Declaration?

Ans. A serious speech about God in which we declare that we know God as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Recite the Lord's Prayer. Where is it found in the Bible?

Ans. Matt 6:5-13

What is a creed?

Ans. A summary of our faith.

What is the first creed?

Ans. Jesus is Lord

Recite the Apostle's Creed. When was the creed written?

Ans. About 100 years after Christ's death.

Recite the Ten Commandments. Where are they found in the Bible. Ans. In the Book of Exodus 20:1-17; Deut 5:1-21 (See attached)

Read your own statement of faith which you have written.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS RE THE APOSTLES' CREED

WHAT IS A CREED? Ans: A summary of what we believe.

1. WHO IS GOD?

Ans: The Father, Almighty, Maker of Heaven and Earth

2. WHO IS JESUS?

Ans: Jesus Christ is the only Son our Lord. God in the flesh.

3. HOW WAS GOD BORN?

Ans: He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

4. WHAT DID HE DO FOR US?

Ans: He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried.

5. DID HE EXPERIENCE SEPARATION FROM GOD?

Ans: Yes. He descended into hell.

6. DID HE REMAIN IN THE GRAVE?

Ans: No. He ascended into heaven (God's house) and lived with the Father Almighty.

7. WILL JESUS JUDGE US?

Ans: Yes. Together with the Father He will judge the quick (alive) and the dead.

8. DO YOU BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT?

Ans: Yes. The spirit is the feeling of God's presence with us.

9. DO YOU BELIEVE IN THE HOLY CATHOLIC CHURCH?

Ans: Yes. The Catholic Church is not just the church in Rome but all churches. Another way of saying this is we believe in the "One Holy Universal Christian Church".

10. DO YOU BELIEVE IN THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS?

Ans: Yes. Saints are those who follow Jesus. The Communion of Saints is a fellowship of those who are living with the Lord forever.

11. ARE OUR SINS FORGIVEN?

Ans: Yes. If we confess belief in the Lord Jesus, we can receive his love and live with him forever. The past is finished and gone, everything becomes fresh and new. Friends, believe the Good News of the Gospel, in Jesus Christ we are forgiven.

12. DO WE BELIEVE CHRIST ROSE FROM THE DEAD?

FEED MY SHEEP

THEOLOGICAL BASE:

Starting with Jesus instructions to the disciples in the Gospel of John (John 21:15-17), Christians know it is God's will that they feed hungry people of the world. All persons are children of God, made in his image, and persons for whom his Son died. They are all among his sheep. With this as a starting place, our mission in feeding his sheep is shaped by Jesus teaching.

ASPECTS OF MISSION:

1. EMERGENCY FOOD: When individuals come to the Parsonage in need of food, the Pastor and the Parsonage Household do their best to respond with a sandwich, soup, coffee, etc. It is our policy not to provide financial assistance. Many of those who come are involved in the use of alcohol or drugs. The Household avoids making judgmental responses to those in need. Each person's need for food is accepted at face value. Each one is seen as carrying the image of God and the face of

Jesus. In these situations sometimes Jesus comes to the door and is drunk or on drugs and sometimes he comes back more than once.

2. FOOD FOR FAMILIES:

a. For those not in the Parish:

When food is requested for families not in the parish, these persons are referred to HUD, 2638 Fait Ave., Baltimore, 21224 (410) 396-9093 for screening. Diane Baker is the Director of HUD. HUD is the human services organization administered by the city and designed to serve local residents, neighborhood schools, social service and political organizations, and churches. HUD also serves our neighborhood organization called SEARCH.

SEARCH (South East Association Resolved to Combat Hunger). This organization is Chaired by The Rev. John Spencer, Pastor of the Canton Baptist Church, 3302 Toone Street, Baltimore, 21224 (410-563-1177) and in cooperation with HUD, coordinates the work of local churches and neighborhood social service resources in the fight against hunger. SEARCH is also supported by the Maryland Food Committee and coordinates its work with this state and city wide organization. In a severe emergency, United maintains some emergency food supplies to meet the needs of families not in the parish. This food is located in food bins in Friendship Hall and is administered

by the Pastor with the support of the Church Secretary, following review of the request for food and referral to HUD for long term assistance.

b. For those in the Parish:

Emergency food is kept on hand to meet the needs of families in the parish. As with families not in the parish, this food is located in food bins in Friendship Hall and is administered by the Pastor and Church Secretary.

c. Food Bank:

An area food bank is maintained and administered by the Canton Baptist Church and Center at the Baptist Church at 3002 Toone St., Baltimore, 21224 (410-563-1177). United, and other churches contribute food to stock this resource. HUD and the Department of Social Services use this resource for emergency food assistance to persons in the area.

d. Thanksgiving and Christmas Baskets:

United, like many churches, collects food for these holiday times. While we want to see that families in need get these gifts from our church, we are aware that some will get baskets from other churches regardless of what systems we devise and that some will receive help from other sources such as children, parents, relatives, social service agencies etc. That some will receive more than others is one of the risks we take in "feeding God's sheep". However, to guide our

use of resources we have created the following procedures.

1. All requests for holiday food will be in writing in which the need for food is explained. This will take the form of a simple note. These notes will be given to the church secretary.

2. A Committee will be appointed by the Church Council to administer the program and recommend whether help will be distributed in the form of a gift certificate, food baskets, work, or perhaps some other form.

3. The Council Committee will review requests for food and set priorities for giving. First priority will be given to parish families in need. The Council Committee will assist the President in appointing a group to prepare the baskets for delivery and to purchase turkeys, hams, etc. when the decision has been made to purchase these.

4. Food will be delivered to families only when necessary. In this way contact can be made with many of those most in need. At the same time, we will encourage recipients to come to the church when possible to pick up bags of groceries and baskets.

5. Help will be concentrated in our neighborhood so baskets and other assistance will be limited generally only to those

in zones 22124 or 22213.

6. The Church Secretary will maintain the list of those applying for food and assistance.
