# The Cross and the Crown


**W**HY did Jesus have to suffer torture and experience what mortals call "death"? Because that was His mission. Mark tells us (10:45), "*For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.*"

Perhaps we can understand the *whys* of His death better if we recall the circumstances under which our country came into being. The men at Lexington and Concord also gave their lives as "a ransom for many." There was something called "freedom," without which they found life intolerable. And so, many of them died that others who came after them might have this precious gift.

Thus it was with Jesus. He came into a world filled with intolerance and injustice; a world where men followed the "party line," and any who attempted to challenge the established order were obliged to recant or be put to death. He had a gift to offer more precious than earthly freedom — the gift of eternal life.

Few would accept the gift. The ultimate in human agony would be required of Jesus. When it was all over, a few would know the glorious truth. They would "*go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.*"

And since "The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant before his lord" (Matt. 10:24) we too, must be ready to make sacrifices. There is no crown for those who will not share the burden of the cross.
