

The Special Congregational Meeting of the United Evangelical Church was held on Sunday, March 19, 1972.

The meeting was called to order by President Arthur Block. President Block requested the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting. A motion was made by Ray Schmitt to dispense with the reading of the minutes. This motion was seconded by Robert Logue and was carried.

Mr. Block described the difficulty with water seepage in the parsonage that had been discovered by the Property Committee of the Church Council. The threat of damage to the interior of the parsonage and the "immediate need to rectify this situation" was the reason Mr. Block called this special meeting. The Property Committee of the Church Council, recognizing the need to have the mortar of the parsonage walls pointed up, had solicited bids from various masonry contractors. The Committee received bids of \$4,200.00 and \$3,200.00 for the complete pointing up of the building and a bid of \$1,700.00 for a partial pointing up in the most critical areas of the walls only. The Council, upon considering the condition of the walls and the various bids, had decided to recommend the acceptance of the bid of \$3,200.00 for the completion of the needed repairs.

Mr. Block recommended the acceptance of the bid of \$3,200.00 and requested a motion that the congregation approve the Council's request. Albert Fader made a motion that the congregation approve the request of the Church Council to have the needed repairs performed for the cost of \$3,200.00. William Lochmann seconded the motion and it was carried.

There being no other business to be presented to the congregation at this time, President Block requested a motion that the meeting be adjourned.

Fred Long made a motion that the meeting be adjourned. It was seconded by Ernest Jones and was carried. Mr. Block declared the meeting adjourned.
