THE CROSS AND THE CROWN


Why did Jesus have to suffer torture and experience what mortals call "death"? Because that was His mission. Mark tells us (10:45), "*For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.*"

Thus it was with Jesus. He came into a world filled with intolerance, and injustice; a world where men followed the "party line," and any who attempted to challenge the established order were obliged to recant or be put to death. He had a gift to offer more precious than earthly freedom--the gift of eternal life.

Few could accept the gift. The ultimate in human agony would be required of Jesus. When it was all over, a few would know the glorious truth. They would "*go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature*".

And, since "*The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant before his Lord*" (Matt. 10:24) we too, must be ready to make sacrifices. There is no crown for those who will not share the burden of the cross.

The "*burden of the cross*" is not something we have but something we need. It is the brokenness needed for our human pride and self-sufficiency. It is the pouring out of God's forgiveness for our sinfilled thoughts, words, and deeds. It is our need to experience a broken and contrite human spirit, necessary to receive the fullness of God's love.
