and Oyster Supper:





The Church Secretary, Millie Slechta, kept calling to find out what the hold up was. They were supposed to deliver before 10:00 a.m., but did not come until 11:30 a.m. This caused a problem because the help was there and ready to work, but the vegetables weren't. Maybe if we asked for delivery before 9:00 a.m. or even the day before, we can be sure there will be no delays in the preparation of the meal.

The financial part I do not know. I believe there is still money coming in. I do know that I was given \$600.00 in advance, and I returned \$136.94 to Mr. Randy Schmitt. Also two one hundred dollar checks were made out to Mrs. Smiths Pies.
