
LITTLE HOUSE OF FREEDOM

"In all the time of our existence we have never closed the door on anyone," says Tilda Kemplen, founder of the Little House of Freedom in White Oaks, TN. "We're not about to start turning people away now."


WHEN GIVING COMES HOME


ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

TOWARD A MORE CHRISTIAN LIFESTYLE


“They will know we are Christians by our love.” It’s an old, old theme! Loving one another and loving the world—as God does—is the very hallmark of a Christian lifestyle. Yet look about you: immense poverty, massive hunger, and overwhelming suffering mark our world.

Lent is an appropriate time for us to ask whether our lifestyle as Christians has become indistinguishable from that of the world about us. Long seen as a time for self-denial, Lent provides opportunity to not only deny self, but also to affirm others.

So, in some places, small groups of Christians have determined to eat less meat, to grow their own vegetables, to spend less on commercial entertainment, or to join a buying cooperative as a kind of witness to a simpler, more Christian lifestyle. It is not enough to avoid being part of the problem for those about us. We can do no less than to act in their behalf—both directly through such means as the One Great Hour of Sharing and indirectly through efforts to contain and redirect the powers and principalities that keep people poor, hungry, and suffering. This, too, is part of the lifestyle toward which we Christians move.



THE CROSS AND THE CROWN

Why did Jesus have to suffer torture and experience what mortals call death? Because that was His mission. Mark tells us (10:45), "For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Thus it was with Jesus. He came into a world filled with intolerance, and injustice; a world where men followed the "party line," and any who attempted to challenge the established order were obliged to recant or be put to death. He had a gift to offer more precious than earthly freedom --- the gift of eternal life.

Few could accept the gift. The ultimate in human agony would be required of Jesus. When it was all over, a few would know the glorious truth. They would "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

And, since "The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant before his Lord" (Matt. 10:24) we too, must be ready to make sacrifices. There is no crown for those who will not share the burden of the cross.

The "burden of the cross" is not something we have but something we need. It is the brokenness needed for our human pride and self-sufficiency. It is the pouring out of God's forgiveness for our sinfilled thoughts, words, and deeds. It is our need to experience a broken and contrite human spirit, necessary to receive the fullness of God's love.





I JOHN 5:1-6

A *New Yorker* cartoon has a preacher in his pulpit telling the congregation, "I'm O.K. and you're O.K.," while the people answer, "Amen, brother, you're O.K. and we're O.K." That picture is not one we get from the writer of *I John*. He sees the world gripped by "the evil one." It is a world that put Jesus to death and that tests us to our core. But, he says, God gives power to survive and know victory. That victory is God's gift. We gain it by faith in the risen Christ. We are to respond to it by loving others who, like us, also struggle to overcome the world.


A PEACEMAKING CHURCH

Is the United Church of Christ a peacemaking church? A quick look at our General Synod priorities and our church's mission and ministry clearly reveals that the answer is YES!

Last June, delegates to the Thirteenth General Synod of our UCC overwhelmingly voted to make peace and peacemaking a top priority of our denomination for the next four years. Our UCC president, Dr. Avery Post, asked the delegates this question concerning the arms race: "Do you doubt that this is a fundamental issue of justice for our children, grandchildren, and the future of the globe?"

And Dr. Zelle Andrews, director of our UCC Peace Advocacy Project says, "We must face this issue as a community of church people—of people who have faith in the God of all creation, and in Jesus Christ who, by his life and teachings, called us as believers to be peacemakers, the children of God."

"We may disagree about how to achieve peace," Dr. Andrews says. But the diversity of our UCC has always been our greatest strength. And through our diversity, we must continue to witness for peacemaking in whatever way we can—we *are*—a peacemaking church!


FAITH AND LEARNING TOGETHER

I JOHN 3:1-3

"We are God's children." What does that mean? It means, or says something about our worth. We are more than dust of the earth, coming from nowhere and vanishing into nowhere. Our being is God's gift. It bears the divine stamp. We are made in the image of God. It says something about divine virtue. It does not deny our goodness, but sees its source in God's gracious gift to the members of God's household. It suggests something about our destiny. We are not all we yet will be. What we do become will grow from kinship with the Divine Parent of the whole human family.

THE CHURCH LIVES THE SCRIPTURES

"God's Word open for all in the 80's" was the theme chosen by the United Bible Societies at meetings in Chaing Mai, Thailand, in 1980. Seeking to be obedient to this challenge, the U.B.S. is committed to strive constantly toward the achievement of this objective.

About 97% of the world's people already have the Scriptures in whole or in part in their language. The real problem is that those of us who have the Scriptures fail to "live" by the principles clearly contained therein.

"FARM AFTER FARM STANDS EMPTY"


Darkened, empty farmhouses surround the farm where Ruth Ellen and LaVern Truby live in northeast Nebraska's Cedar County. More than three-fourths of their neighbors have moved away.

"Farm after farm stands empty," says Ruth Ellen. "We've almost seen it settled and unsettled in our lifetime."

In Cedar County, as in other parts of our country, small farms are being forced to close by inflation, unfavorable taxes, and prices. More than 1,100 churches in our United Church of Christ are in farm or open country where small farmers are being swallowed up by private investors and corporations.

One way the UCC is reaching out to struggling farmers is through the Small Farm Energy Project, a project our United Church Board for Homeland Ministries helped to start. The project helps family farmers to save money by using alternative forms of energy.

"As well as suggestions, we found encouragement and support," Ruth Ellen Truby says of this project—just one of many UCC projects focused on American farm life that we help to support through our regular gifts to *Our Christian World Mission*.

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN EASTERTIDE

MAY 23, 1982

JOHN 17:11-19

God has a "lover's quarrel" with the world. This prayer of Jesus, reported by John, reflects that quarrel. Christians live in that real world—the one that put Jesus to death and makes discipleship costly today. We are not disembodied spirits free-floating in space. We have been "sent into the world." Nevertheless, something about us is "not of the world." We sense kinship with the power that fires the sun, orders the spiritual reality that pervades Creation, and finally will conquer every force that contends against the just and loving intention of God.

OUR "EVANGELICAL" HERITAGE

The Evangelical Synod of North America, founded at St. Louis, Missouri, in 1840 as the German Evangelical Church-Union of the West, was the only American denomination that from the beginning united German Lutheran and Reformed traditions.


The Evangelicals ministered largely to immigrants from German-speaking countries (including Russians and Hungarians), but adapted quickly to more flexible American ways. They founded church-related hospitals, orphanages, homes for the aged, and homes for the retarded. They also developed strong programs of confirmation instruction and of education for ministers.

The Evangelicals were unusual among later American immigrant churches in combining ability to organize autonomous ethnic congregations and associations on the frontier, with a manifestation of an open theological attitude, effective church union activity, and warm home-and foreign-mission efforts. All this they did under the authority of the church, which they thought of as universal, reforming, and evangelical. In 1934, the Evangelical Synod of North America joined the German Reformed Church in the U.S. to form the Evangelical and Reformed Church. From this heritage, Evangelicals became part of the United Church of Christ in 1957.



PENTECOST SUNDAY

MAY 30, 1982

ACTS 2:1-13

A JOYFUL FINALE

Pentecost brings the Easter season to a joyful finale. The world rejoices without restraint for the God who raised Jesus from death and raised the church, sent it on its missionary task, and gave the Holy Spirit to be its life-giving soul.

The roots of Pentecost are in the Jewish festival of *Shavuot*, of which the Greek word *Pentecost* is equivalent—the “fiftieth day.” Shavuot is the fiftieth day after the beginning of Passover; the Christian Pentecost is the fiftieth day of Easter. For Israel, Shavuot was a day of thanksgiving for the wheat harvest, an annual commemoration of the giving of the Law that marked a new relationship between Israel and the God who had delivered them from Egypt in the Exodus; so Pentecost marks the beginning of a new relationship between humanity and the God who raised Jesus from the dead.


On that Pentecost following Jesus’ resurrection, Jews from all parts of the Empire were gathered together. The hearing in one language came as a sign of the reversal of Babel when the unity of the people of earth was broken by sin.

The Spirit comes to bring together the scattered of earth. The Spirit comes to heal division and restore unity. Just as all barriers of nationality and language were transcended in the first-century Pentecost, so is it for us a sign of that day when all barriers separating people will be broken down and humanity will find its true unity in God.

TRINITY SUNDAY

Some people live as God's enemy and defy what God intends. Others are simply indifferent to God. But some are like Paul. They know that God makes a home in human hearts and are at home in God. This at homeness does not guarantee a full answer to every need. Like any good home, however, it builds power to live with unhealed hurt, unanswered questions, and guilt over sin that is hard to believe forgiven, even though it is. God takes such persons into the Family, makes them coheirs with Christ, and sees that they inherit every gift the Spirit can bestow.

WOMEN MISSIONARIES IN THE UCC

In 1812, when the first American Protestant missionaries were ordained and commissioned for overseas service, their wives and fiancées sat as spectators in a nearby pew. A few days later, however, two of the women were to constitute half of the "missionary company" that set sail from Salem, Massachusetts, enroute to India!

Today, *over half* of the missionaries in our United Church of Christ are women. About a third are teachers, and many others are in church leadership development, community development, and health fields. Some women serving overseas are clergy, several are in theological education, and still others accompany and complement the work of their husbands.

Many of our women missionaries are in leadership roles. Dr. Ruth Catton, for instance, is the director of a 25-bed rural hospital in Baitalpur, India. Gaby Hein is another leader. She initiated a self-help sewing and knitting project among women in a squatter area of Kenya, Africa.

We help to support the important work of all UCC missionaries—both women and men—through our regular gifts to *Our Christian World Mission*.


LAYPERSONS ARE TAKING THE LEAD





II CORINTHIANS 5:6-10

When you lend money that you can't afford to lose, or sit back, relaxed, on your first jet flight, you demonstrate "faith in general." But when the Apostle Paul says he walks by faith, that faith is not "faith in general." It is faith in Christ. This faith is not due to what is in sight. It is due to *insight*. It can "see" God at work, even when God works in obscurity. Such faith produces the courage of confident readiness to run real risks for Jesus Christ.

A FIGHTING CHANCE FOR SURVIVAL


Life was hard enough for five-year-old Jayakumar's parents in Vellore, India. By making "beedies," an Indian version of cigarettes, Jayakumar's parents earned about 85¢ between them with which they took care of their four children. The family lived in a mud hut that they put up in the slum area near Vellore.

Then Jayakumar contracted tuberculosis. The five-year-old's future looked grim—his parents could afford neither the cost of treatment nor the nutritional supplements essential to build up Jayakumar's resistance.

It is only through free medical care provided by Vellore Christian Medical College and Hospital that Jayakumar has a fighting chance for survival. The hospital spent about \$65 for drugs and nutritional supplements to treat Jayakumar, and a doctor is regularly examining the boy at the hospital's Community Health Clinic located in the slum area.

By supporting Vellore Christian Medical College and Hospital, we are helping to provide compassion and care through this hospital, *and* we are helping to train badly-needed medical personnel to serve in clinics and hospitals throughout India and around the world.
