## FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

JULY 4, 1982

JOB 38:1-11

All the questions were in. Job had piled them up until they reached heaven. He had protested the absurdity of evil that visits pain on the good and bad alike; the unfairness of a life in which virtue gets no consistent reward. How could anyone claim God to be both just *and* powerful? One trait or the other had to be flawed. Now, God stood before Job. There were no answers, only more questions. And those questions point to deeper mystery: foundations supporting all existence, limits on any power to destroy, and dawn that dissolves every night into daybreak.

### ALARM AROUND THE ARMS RACE


The time seemed right for Rev. Jim Todhunter, pastor of Norwich Congregational Church (United Church of Christ) in Vermont, to become more active in peacemaking efforts. About a year ago, his congregation began to “express anguish and alarm around the arms race,” Rev. Todhunter says. At about the same time, he attended a retreat focusing on the arms race and the Book of Revelations.

“The Bible study, prayer and meditation from Revelations showed the arms race in a spiritual context,” says Rev. Todhunter. “The Bomb has become our idol, our false god. Of course, a false god promises you what you need and eventually demands everything you have—it devours you.”

After a period of study and reflection, persons in the Norwich Church formed a World Peacemakers Group, part of a national peacemaking network, and worked on a resolution calling for support of a nuclear arms freeze. Some people in the congregation are trying to develop a cultural exchange program with people in the U.S.S.R.

The Norwich Church and many other UCC churches across the country serve to remind us of actions that UCC folk are taking to work for world peace. As Rev. Todhunter says, “Whatever your role in life, your vocation, your experience, you have opportunities. Everyone is equipped to bring their own background to bear on the arms race.”

MARK 5:21-43


What contrast between the stories that focus on Jairus' daughter and Abel's brother! In one, for envy, Cain murders Abel. When God asks Cain, "Where is your brother?" Cain virtually replies, "Why should I care?" And judgment falls on Cain like an axe. In Mark's story, Jesus offers a dead child a gesture and a word. And heaven's redemption rains on her. Does not heaven rain judgment on us when we ignore others in their need? And do not we participate in God's redemption when we share with troubled people an affirming word, a loving gesture, and a generous act?

### WHAT COLOR IS YOUR PARACHUTE?

"Once upon a time, I was struck by a thought: some people are more successful than others at job-hunting or changing careers. Why? What do they do that the rest of us don't do?," asks Richard N. Bolles in his introduction to *What Color Is Your Parachute?*, a practical manual for job-hunters and career-changers.

Updated annually, *What Color Is Your Parachute?* has been a bestseller for the past five years, but what isn't generally known is that the United Church of Christ had some part in developing this resource. Rev. Bolles, an Episcopalian priest, is a staff person in United Ministries in Education, an interdenominational group in which the UCC also participates. In 1972, United Ministries in Education initiated a career development program when it became apparent that job choice and career change was a growing concern in our society. A resource needed to be developed for that program, and *What Color Is Your Parachute?* was born.

Our part in the development of this resource came through our support of the work of the United Ministries in Education, a relationship that we maintain through our United Church Board for Homeland Ministries and supported by our gifts to Our Christian World Mission.

## SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

II CORINTHIANS 12:7-10

Depression and pain can come as intruders that cripple the ability to work and get on with your normal life. To your doctor they can appear as symptoms of disease. Whatever Paul meant by his thorn, it prompted him to pray and drove him to discover Christ's power. Have you some "thorn?" Get rid of it, if you can—with help if it takes that. Let it also prompt you to pray and, in days of depression, anxiety, or other difficulty, to get hold of Christ's grace and power, until you find that Christ is there, even when your thorn inflicts its greatest pain.

### AGRICULTURAL WORK IN BANGLADESH

Imagine a country slightly smaller in size than the state of Wisconsin, but with a population of more than 88 million people! The country is Bangladesh.

The very name Bangladesh conjures up images of disaster. Born in 1971 after a nine-months' war of independence from Pakistan, the country has been clouded constantly since then by floods and famine.

But Bangladesh has struggled to maintain itself under the weight of these disasters, and the whole world seems to know and care about the suffering of the Bangladeshi people.

Christians have responded through their participation in and financial support of the World Council of Churches and the National Council of Churches. The WCC's Commission on World Mission and Evangelism and the NCC's Church World Service have aided the Christian Commission for Development in Bangladesh in its agricultural development projects. Large areas of the country are suitable for growing rice and jute, the bases of the country's most important industry.


Aid to Bangladesh is just one example of Christians joining together and responding ecumenically to the suffering in the world.

## EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

EPHESIANS 1:3-10

Religion that is nothing but rules gets tiresome. It can be a burden bound to our backs. The *Ephesian* writer seems to know that. Later, we will be told to grow up, speak the truth, live in patience, bear with each other in love. But there is a prior place for praise. So the letter opens: "Blessed be the God . . . who has blessed us in Christ." Here, faith does not hobble the soul. It lifts the soul until it soars and sings for joy in Jesus, by whom God meets our need with lavish love.

### PRIME-TIME GOSPEL?

Recently I was viewing a prime-time television show with my two teenage daughters. The program plot revolved around an unmarried woman whose parents were visiting her for the first time since she fled from home several years before. When it appeared that their reconciliation attempt was about to fail, the woman brought out a letter she had written to her parents some years before when she was alone in a strange city, about to give birth to an out-of-wedlock child. In the letter the daughter expressed feelings of fear, loneliness and deep love for her parents. The letter was sent, but returned unopened with the cold words scrawled in her father's handwriting, "Return to Sender."

A few minutes later the television program ended with the family beginning its reconciliation. And it was at that moment my 13-year-old looked up at me and said, "Dad, why are you crying? Your tears are all the way to your neck!"

The tears were there because I had been reminded of how fragile loving relationships can be. The tears were there because I had witnessed how crucial confession, repentance, and reconciliation are for the healing of fragmented love. The tears were there because I recognized the message of Christ at a rather unexpected moment . . . via a commercial television program.



## NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

AUGUST 1, 1982

MARK 6:30-34

"Coming and going." The phrase makes you think of an airport: hubbub, bustle, movement in a thousand directions. And you want to ask, "To what end?" No wonder the disciples were frazzled. Too much of coming and going and you can lose your sense of mission. But Jesus was perceptive and considerate. He simply bid the disciples to "Come away and rest." And they went to seek solitude. Even when the crowd found them, the confusion and hunger of that crowd was a call to mission. So, tired or not, Jesus went to work to meet their need.

### OUR "CONGREGATIONAL" HERITAGE

With roots in late sixteenth-century England, where small groups of Calvinists sought to complete the Protestant Reformation begun by Calvin and Luther, Congregationalists did not agree with the established church and were persecuted. In the American colonies, Congregationalists "covenanted" together to form "free" churches, binding themselves to walk in God's ways and to remain open to God's truth.


Congregationalists pioneered in mission work among the Indians. Later, when Americans moved West, they founded many frontier churches, colleges, and home-missionary societies. In 1810, they established foreign mission work, especially in the Pacific Islands and in Asia. As our nation anguished over the slave issue, Congregationalists worked in various ways to free Blacks. After the emancipation, they established schools to help ex-slaves take their rightful places in society. Congregational churches were also the very first to ordain and call female clergy.

Theologically flexible, Congregationalists did not formally organize as a national denomination until the second half of the nineteenth century. They have always worked ecumenically and enthusiastically for the gospel, trusting that when two or three gather together in Christ's name, God's truth and the church will endure. In keeping with this tradition, Congregationalists joined in 1929 with The Christian Churches and in 1957 became part of the United Church of Christ.

EPHESIANS 4:1-6, 11-16



The Mediterranean world had many gods, faiths, and value systems. So also has twentieth century America. We sing, “The church’s one foundation is Jesus Christ.” But the church lives in a pluralism. It is important to believe and work for the oneness of God’s people. Yet it is also important to affirm, respect, and celebrate the variety with which God enriches our nation’s life today.

## ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

AUGUST 15, 1982

EXODUS 16:2-4, 12-15

In the wilderness, God promised bread. But, the Israelites were not to be greedy. They were to take just enough bread for each day. That word against greed needs to be heeded now. Our wealth enables us to consume enormous quantities of grain in the form of meat, milk, and eggs. The average Russian or American we are told uses roughly four times the land, water, and fertilizer used by an Indian (Asian), a Colombian, or a Nigerian. Hunger kills humans. Thus, the word, "gather a day's portion," comes to us with the urgency of divine command.

### MEALS ON WHEELS

During World War II in England, mobile canteens used for soldiers' coffee and donuts were found to be useful to serve hot meals to elderly shut-ins. Lady Reading brought the idea to the United States in the 1950s, thereby starting the volunteer program known as Meals on Wheels.

In St. Louis, Missouri, Church Women United started the first service of meals in the Lemay neighborhood. Now there are 20 programs throughout the metropolitan area. Meals are professionally prepared in hospitals and nursing homes, then delivered to 1,000 people each week. Over 1,300 volunteers participate in delivering and administering the programs. Those who receive the meals pay if they are able, with the balance of the cost made up by contributions.

Jesus, with great practical insight, understood the hunger of the crowds for physical food. But he reminded the people that the Almighty gives the true bread from heaven. Those of us who have received this true bread consider Meals on Wheels an opportunity for grateful response to our blessing.



### THE SOJOURNER IN OUR COUNTRY


Six-year-old Maria couldn't go to school anymore. With the violence and bloodshed in her country of El Salvador, it simply wasn't safe when she walked home from school in the late afternoon.

Both Maria and her mother, Marguerita, as well as many other persons from El Salvador, fled their war-torn country and made their way to the U.S. Once in Arizona, they were apprehended by the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service and jailed pending deportation hearings. Through the efforts of the Southwest Conference of the United Church of Christ—working with the Religious Task Force on El Salvador in Phoenix—Maria and her mother were able to have their bonds reduced. They then found hospitality in the home of Rev. Alan McLarty, of the Southwest Conference staff, who is active in working with the Salvadoreans in Arizona.

"Our ministry in Arizona is primarily to be with and assist and support those persons who are in our country because of violence in El Salvador," says Rev. McLarty. "We are trying to help the church provide hospitality for the stranger, the sojourner in our country.

"When the people in my church met the Salvadoreans, they saw the *people* there," says Rev. McLarty. "It makes them realize we are talking about human beings, which is a different kind of thing than when we talk about geo-political rights and wrongs."

By standing with the weak, the hungry, the sojourner, we in the United Church of Christ are witnessing to the Good News of peace and compassion.

AUGUST 29, 1982

PROVERBS 9:1-6

Ancient Egypt, Mesopotamia, Syria, and Israel, all had books of wise sayings. Uniquely among them, Hebrew sages saw the close relationship between wisdom and faith. They believed wisdom to be insight into the working of God, who controls everything in heaven and earth. To walk by insight was the door to God's life. The Fourth Gospel saw Jesus in a similar light, as God's highest wisdom. In Christ, God feeds the mind with ultimate truth, the heart with holy love, and the spirit with eternal life. This is the insight in whose way the gospel bids us to walk.

### BREAD FOR THE WORLD

Bread for the world comes through a variety of means available to the church. The most familiar is direct relief aid. Somalia is an example of an area of the world in great material distress. Through the Interchurch Response consortium—Church World Service, Lutheran World Relief, and Catholic Relief Services—Somalia is receiving massive doses of direct aid from churches. More than that, the consortium is working on a development plan that will eventually help the Somali people to rise above their hardships and depend upon themselves for food.


In addition, Somalia received aid directly due to the efforts of Bread for the World, a United States church-related public policy agency supported in part by church hunger funds. Bread for the World is a Christian Citizens Action group that focuses on hunger legislation before the Congress. Its work a year ago was very influential, according to a director of the U.S. Agency for International Development, in passing legislation that allocated \$43 million for food aid in Somalia.

So, through means direct and indirect, the church makes a difference in the lives of hungry people everywhere.
