Pastor Armstrong opened with prayer.

Bill Voelker made a motion and Marty Clement seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes.

Robert Jackson gave the Financial Report. We are \$4340.00 under budget for the month of March.

A correction was made on the Financial Report in the budget column.

A motion was made by George Nassner and seconded by George Finnerty to accept the Financial Report.

CORRESPONDENCE:

All Council members agreed on this.

We received a letter from DC Impact cancelling the sessions scheduled for the month of April, 1995.
