

Tuesday June 4, 1979

The monthly meeting of the Church Council was called to order by the President Mr George Turek. The Pastor led us in prayer.

The following Council members were present, Robert Jackson, Earl Jackson, Lou Oberlander, May Getz, John Strong, Ed. Myers, Carol Weidel, Will Myrick, and Margaret Craig. Mr Bill Hoffman representing the Youth Group. Mrs Margaret Myrick chairperson of the Oyster Supper were also present.

The reading of the minutes for May were read, with one correction Mrs Myrick is leader of the Young Adult Group and not the Youth Group as stated in the May report. This being corrected the minutes stand approve as read..

Mrs Myrick was then given the floor - Subject Sour Beef and Oyster suppers. The date approved by Council was October 23 and 24th. The ticket price was then discussed.
