

March 6, 1984

The secretaries minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

There was a discussion about price of Sour Baef and Oyster Supper tickets. To be decided at a later date.

Harbor Federal Bank \$50,000.00 certificate paying 10% for one year. A transfer was made of \$2,500.00 from Harbor Federal Money Market account to the checking account.

No bill received regarding hospital insurance.
