The regular monthly meeting of the Church Council of United Evangelical Church was held on Tuesday, June 5, 1984 at 8 p.m. President, George Tuerk presiding.

Absent members were: William Voelker, John Strong, George Carrigan.

Pastor Schaefer gave the opening prayer.

The secretaries minutes from the previous meeting were approved as read.

Mr. Tuerk reported:-
