

November 5, 1984

The regular monthly meeting of the Church Council of the United Evangelical Church was called to order by president, Mr. George Tuerk on ^{Monday} Tuesday, November 5, 1984 at 8:00 p.m. All Council members were present except Mr. Paul Bauersfeld.

Mr. William Single, III opened the meeting with a prayer. The secretaries minutes were read and approved as corrected. Mr. Tuerk reported the following:

1. The Church inventory has been mailed to Mr. Cover.
2. Pastor Fair is to meet with the Church and Ministry Committee.
3. The parsonage will not be occupied by Pastor Fair and his wife until December 21st.
4. On December 17th Pastor Fair will take a few days leave of absence to return to Xenia, Ohio to help Mrs. Fair with packing and they will return on December 21st.

The Financial report was approved as presented.

Mr. Tuerk reported the telephone, after office hours, will be dialed into the parsonage. Installation cost \$24.00, monthly charge \$4.00.

The listing of the telephone in the yellow pages approved.

The former pastors name is to be removed and Pastor Fair's name to appear in the listing.

Damage to the telephone service caused by building torn down on Bouldin Street cost the church \$58.00 to repair. This is to be investigated. The secretary is still having trouble with the phone.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

1. Display sign in need of repair and replacement of letters. Mr. John Strong to look into this.
2. The parsonage is just about finished except cleaning carpet. Carpeting will be cleaned also the pastors study, ^{HALL} ~~hall-~~ way, church office, chancel and tower entrance.
3. There will be a walk through on November 18th to see the renovated parsonage.
4. Pastors study, church office and hallway has been painted.
5. The painting and caulking completed on windows and lentils. Parsnage door to be painted white. Mrs. Nancy Gray

to get price on brass address numbers.

6. The Choir room and windows in need of paint. The Choir is to be asked if the small office in the Choir room is needed.

7. The Choir is willing to pay for new drapes in the room.

8. The church office window to be repaired by Mr. Fisher to make it lock.

9. The kitchen walls, kitchen cupboards, tables, hood, risers on steps need to be painted.

10. The outside church doors need to be painted with natural finish.

11. The Church School doors and Dillon Street doors need to be painted. A paint chart will be submitted.

12. The exterior windows on Dillon St. building and windows in alley need to be caulked and painted.

The Council approved the above repairs.

Mr. Tuerk to call the Health Department about pigeons.

13. The church air conditioning system will be worked on this week and winterized.

14. Repairs are needed on circulator pump for church school building. Cost \$800.00. Mr. John Strong to contact Mr. *Carnel* to start repairs.

15. New draperies for the pastor's study and church office approved by Church Council,

CALENDAR COMMITTEE

FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE

The Council approved reception for Pastor Schaeffer. It will be catered by Santoni's for 150 persons.

The Oyster/Sour Beef Supper report read. Net profit on supper \$5,311.08; net profit on raffle \$2,285.46. The combined net profit for supper and raffle \$7,596.54.

Mr. Tuerk read a copy of a letter sent to the Rev. Curtis Clair, Conference Minister, regarding elegant manner in which Pastor Schaeffer served our church.

1985 PROPOSED BUDGET

Mr. Parker explained budget thoroughly.

Changes made in budget:-

1. Church cleaning increased \$500.00
2. Other Benevolences (Chesapeake Center) increased \$1,250.00.

The proposed budget for 1985 totals \$100,245.00.

Mr. Voelker motioned the revised budget for 1985 be accepted. Seconded by Mrs. Nancy Gray. Motion approved.

Mr. Jim Slechta's work schedule discussed, including cleaning church school. Mr. Parker will discuss this again with Mrs. Slechta.

ALTAR COMMITTEE

The Altar committee recommended silk poinsettias be ^{used} ~~used~~. The Council disapproved. There will be no set price for the live poinsettias. Memorials and donations to help defray cost.

The new fire extinguishers have been placed.

Smoke detectors will be installed as follows:

- 3 placed in parsonage
- 1 at top of steps leading to Choir Room.
- 1 on each landing of stairs in Church School building, front and back stairways. (7 detectors)

Mr. Tuerk to contact the Rev. Johnson regarding pay for pastoral services.

Mrs. Slechta will be asked to phone COPE for price of oil.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned with all praying The Lord's Prayer.
