



EARL'S PLACE

A PROJECT OF UNITED MINISTRIES, INC.

FACT SHEET

Earl's Place is a transitional housing program for formerly homeless men. There are thirteen single rooms and two double occupancy rooms allowing for a total of seventeen residents. The first floor room is handicap accessible. The residents share kitchen, dining, laundry and common areas, bathrooms are shared between 2-3 men. There is an apartment on site for the live-in resident manager as well as office space on the first floor.

Residents must:

- be employed or enrolled in a treatment or educational program
- pay a monthly program fee based on their income
- remain drug and alcohol free
- attend NA or AA meetings
- save a percentage of their income
- follow all program rules
- attend a weekly house meeting
- maintain the facility by doing assigned chores.

The men may stay in the program for up to two years, during this time they will address the reasons for their homelessness, address their long term needs and receive assistance in finding permanent housing. The case manager assists the men with locating job skills training, addiction counseling, and reintegration into the community. After the residents move to permanent housing, they are monitored for an additional year.

Earl's Place is named for Earl Johnson, a homeless man who was often a guest at The Supper Club (a soup kitchen at First United Evangelical United Church of Christ). Earl eventually became a volunteer and member of First United. Sadly, Earl drowned in 1993 after falling into the harbor, however, his name lives on through our program which provides services to men in need.


DIRECTIONS TO FIRST AND ST. STEPHEN'S U.C.C.

As you approach Baltimore, you will see signs for the Beltway Interstate 695. Stay on the beltway (Interstate 695) until you come to EXIT 27...DULANEY VALLEY RD.-TOWSON. You will want to go south toward TOWSON. Do not get off at EXIT 26!





Dear Sir/Ma'am

The VA Maryland Health Care System is testing whether a varicella zoster virus vaccine containing the same virus used to immunize children against chicken pox can prevent "shingles" in people who have never had shingles.

Shingles is an infection that causes a painful, blistering rash mainly in people over age 60, increasing in severity with advancing age. Pain can persist long after the rash has healed and can be so severe that sufferers lose the ability to function and/or live independently.

There is no known cure for shingles. Some treatments may help recovery, but are only partially effective. At present, there is no available way to prevent shingles, but preliminary studies show that this vaccine may boost immunity, which could help the body prevent shingles.

Potential participants will be asked to answer several health related questions and then receive either the vaccine or a placebo (a dose which contains no active ingredients). Thereafter they will be followed by phone to determine if the vaccine reduces the frequency of shingles.



OPENING HYMN: JESUS LOVES ME!

PRAYER:

THANK YOU JESUS FOR BRINGING US HERE TODAY TO BE WITH YOU AND TO GIVE THANKS FOR YOUR LOVE AND CARE FOR EACH OF YOUR CHILDREN. AMEN

LESSON: WHY DO WE HAVE A LIVING CROSS?

*TO REMIND US THAT ON EASTER MORNING JESUS' FRIENDS WERE SAD BECAUSE THEY THOUGHT HE HAD DIED AND WAS FOREVER IN THE GRAVE.

*BUT WHEN THEY WENT TO THE GRAVE THEY SAW THE BIG STONE AT THE GRAVE WAS ROLLED BACK. HIS BODY WAS NOT THERE. HAD HIS ENEMIES STOLEN IT?

*NO. THEY FOUND HE WAS ALIVE. HE TALKED TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS. HE ATE FISH WITH THEM. THEY TOUCHED HIS BODY AND FELT HIS WOUNDS. HE WALKED ALONG THE ROAD WITH THEM AND HE TAUGHT THEM ABOUT GOD. HE TOLD THEM NOT TO BE SAD ANYMORE. HE WAS ALIVE. HE HAD RISEN FROM THE DEAD. HE SHOWED THEM THERE WAS LIFE AFTER DEATH.

*IT IS LIKE WHEN BULBS ARE PLANTED IN THE EARTH. THEY SLEEP DURING THE WINTER AND IT SEEMS THAT THEY ARE DEAD. BUT IN THE SPRING WHEN WE GO TO THE GARDEN WE SEE THEM. THEY COME TO LIFE AGAIN; AFTER THE HARD WINTER WE THOUGHT THEY WERE DEAD BUT FOUND THAT WAS NOT TRUE. THEY CAME TO LIFE AGAIN. GOD GIVES US THE GIFT OF LIFE IN THESE BEAUTIFUL FLOWERS. TODAY WE ARE GOING TO REMEMBER THE NEW LIFE JESUS GAVE US. THE DAFFODILS OR CARNATIONS YOU WILL BE GIVEN WILL REMIND YOU OF JESUS GIFT OF NEW LIFE WHICH WE CELEBRATE TODAY. THAT JESUS LIVES AND IS HERE WITH US. WE WILL USE THEM TODAY TO BUILD THE LIVING CROSS OF JESUS. THIS CROSS REMINDS US THAT EVEN THOUGH PEOPLE TRIED TO KILL JESUS THAT HE ROSE FROM THE DEAD AND THAT HE LIVES AND IS WITH US RIGHT HERE - TODAY!

EACH CHILD AND EACH PERSONS PRESENT IS GIVEN A DAFFODIL OR CARNATION TO CARRY FORWARD TO THE CHANCEL TO HELP BUILD THE LIVING CROSS. HELPERS WILL GUIDE EACH PARTICIPANT TO PLACE A FLOWER IN THE LIVING CROSS. THE CROSS IS IN THE MIDDLE OF THE CHANCEL.

PRAYER: THANK YOU GOD, FOR THE MANY THINGS YOU HAVE GIVEN TO US. HELP US TO HELP OTHER CHILDREN BY GIVING AND SHARING EVERYDAY. WE PRAY THIS PRAYER IN JESUS' NAME. AMEN

FOLLOWING THE BUILDING OF THE CROSS THE CELEBRANT WILL SAY: LET US STAND AND SAY THE ANCIENT EASTER GREETING! PASTOR: "CHRIST IS RISEN!" CHILDREN RAISE HANDS AND ARMS AND REPLY: "HE IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUIA!" THE PASTOR AND CHURCH SCHOOL DIRECTOR WILL THEN BLESS EACH CHILD AND PRESENT EACH ONE A SMALL GIFT CROSS WHICH SAYS "JESUS LOVES ME"!

EVERYONE STANDS AND SINGS THE CLOSING HYMN.
HYMN: "CHRIST THE LORD IS RISEN TODAY!"

(P) When the Lord was buried, they sealed the tomb, rolling a great stone to the door of the tomb, and they stationed soldiers to guard him.

(L) The chief priests gathered before Pilate and petitioned him: And they stationed soldiers to guard him.

The Tenth Candle is Extinguished

(P) God did not spare his own Son, but delivered him up for us all.

(L) He was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and he opened not his mouth.

The Eleventh Candle is Extinguished

(P) They shall mourn for him as one mourns for an only child; for the Lord, who is without sin, is slain.

The Twelfth Candle is Extinguished

(P) From the gates of hell, O Lord, deliver my soul.

(L) In my despair I said, "In the noonday of my life I must depart: my unspent years are called to the portals of death."

"No more shall I see the Lord in the land of the living, never more look on my kind among dwellers on earth."

"Between sunrise and sunset my life is brought to an end; I cower and hope for the dawn."

"From the gates of hell, O Lord, deliver my soul."

The Last Candle is Extinguished

(P) O death, I will be your death; O grave, I will be your destruction.

(L) My flesh also shall rest in hope: you will not let your Holy One see corruption.

(P) Now the women sitting at the tomb made lamentation, weeping for the Lord.

(P) Christ for us became obedient to the point of death-- even death on a cross.

Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the Name which is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend.

The Stripping of the Chancel by the Acolytes

(L) Almighty God, we pray you to behold graciously this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross.

*Observing the discipline of Silence, and with soft music playing, the lights will be brought up to a dim position. **Let us all now depart in SILENCE.** All talking is delayed until the congregation is outside the Church Building.*

The Fourth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) **And Jesus said "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture me? Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me; but now, behold, you scourge me, and lead me away to be crucified."**
- (L) When they had laid hands on Jesus and were holding him, he said: "Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me: but now, behold, you scourge me, and lead me away to be crucified."

The Fifth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) **Darkness covered the whole land when Jesus had been crucified: and about the ninth hour he cried with a loud voice: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" and he bowed his head and handed over his spirit.**
- (L) Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit. And he bowed his head and handed over his spirit."

The Sixth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) **See how the righteous one perishes, and no one takes it to heart. The righteous are taken away, and no one understands. From the face of evil the righteous one is taken away, and his memory shall be in peace.**
- (L) Like a sheep before its shearers is mute, so he opened not his mouth. By oppression and judgment he was taken away: and his memory shall be in peace.

The Seventh Candle is Extinguished

- (P) **I was like a trusting lamb led to the slaughter. I did not know it was against me that they devised schemes, saying, "Let us destroy the tree with its fruit; let us cut him off from the land of the living."**
- (L) All my enemies whispered together against me, and devised evil against me, saying: "let us destroy the tree with its fruit; Let us cut him off from the land of the living."

The Eighth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) **The veil of the temple was torn in two, and the earth shook, and the thief from the cross cried out, "Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom."**
- (L) The rocks were split, the tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who slept were raised: and the earth shook, and the thief from the cross cried out, "Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

The Ninth Candle is Extinguished

ORDER FOR THE TENEBRAE

The name Tenebrae (the Latin word for "darkness" or "shadows") has for centuries been applied to ancient monastic services held during the last three days of Holy Week.

The extinguishing of the candles symbolizes the coming of death to Jesus and the descent of darkness upon the world, to be released only by the glorious resurrection on Easter.

All lights in the church will be extinguished until only the Christ Candle, symbolizing the eternal light of God, remains. Toward the end of the service this candle is hidden, typifying the apparent victory of the forces of evil.

At the very end, a loud noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the time of the resurrection.

The Christ Candle is now restored to its place and by its light all depart in silence.

(L) Let us begin the story of the last days of Christ on earth.

P) Jesus first instituted "The Last Supper" with his followers the night he was arrested. After they had sung the last hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives where Jesus prayed to the Father: "Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

(L) Stay awake and pray, that you may not enter into the time of trial. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

The First Candle is Extinguished

(P) And Jesus said, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to the point of death; remain here, and watch with me. Now you shall see the crowd who will surround me; you will flee, and I will go to be offered up for you."

(L) Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. You will flee, and I will go to be offered up for you.

The Second Candle is Extinguished

(P) Lo, we have seen him without beauty or majesty; with no looks to attract our eyes. He bore our sins and grieved for us, he was wounded for our transgression, and by his scourging we are healed.

(L) Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; and by his scourging we are healed.

The Third Candle is Extinguished

(P) The kings of the earth rise up in revolt, and the princes plot together, against the Lord and against his Anointed. They divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing. False witnesses have risen up against me, and also those who speak malice.

(L) They divide my garments among them. They cast lots for my clothing.


