

Bob loved your church and often said that his time with you was the high point of his life. He treasured the traditions, dedication and religious faith of the congregation. He often talked of your activities and projects, such as your wonderful Sour Beef Dinners, the restoration of the Tower and Clock and the Blessing of the Animals. Reaching out to the members of the congregation was a very important part of his ministry, particularly those with family problems, those who were unemployed, those who were sick and those who were dying. Bob had a vision that by building on traditional strengths, your church could become an even more influential factor in the improvement of a rapidly changing Fells Point community.
