

## **Paul A. Rasche** **Pastor in Canton**

The Rev. Paul A. Rasche, a former pastor at the United Evangelical United Church of Christ in Canton, died July 15 in Bedford, England, at the age of 74.

Mr. Rasche, who was traveling and preaching in England, had served at the church from 1961 to 1974.

Before coming to Baltimore he served at churches in Buffalo; South Bend, Ind., and Chicago. He retired in 1977.

Born in Wheeling, W.Va., he received a bachelor's degree from Elmhurst College in Elmhurst, Ill. He graduated from the Eden Theological Seminary in Webster Groves, Mo., with a bachelor of divinity degree.

He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Luella Rasche, of Mira Loma, Calif.; two daughters, Gerda Proctor, of Manassas, Va., and Kyra Ault, of Ontario, Calif.; two brothers, Carl Rasche and Ted Rasche, both of St. Louis, and seven grandchildren.

Memorial services were held last week in Bedford and at United Evangelical Church. Another service will be held in Mira Loma.

GENERAL
