SEPTEMBER 2000 PASTOR'S REPORT

1. Would like Council's approval for a new Advent Wreath. I have photos and measurements of one that was used at another church. We would need to ask someone in the congregation to construct it. The base is wood, with artificial greens stapled on the frame.
ADVANTAGE: This one could rest on steps, and be large enough for all to see.
Would not be as messy as current one.
Would be easier to light.
Easily moved.
2. I have sent out 190 cards out to shut-ins and to birthday people. I have had many people say the personal note has been important to them. I make several phone calls a day to follow-up with people, to check on their care and have made 3 Communion visits, and many hospital and home visits. I also have ordered the HOME DEVOTIONS "letters" that I will write an additional note on which will be mailed monthly. Cas and Darlene are handling the mailing.
3. I have spent 10 ½ hours on pre-marital sessions with the couples of three September weddings, and had two baptismal conferences.
4. I have been with three families who have experienced a death in the family, and officiated at two funerals.
5. Staff meetings will reconvene every other week at the convenience of Cas, Darlene and Pastor. Without regular meetings, communication breaks down about scheduling and other items and misunderstandings occur. How does Council want to handle the extra monthly one hour that Darlene and Cas will be using for staff meetings? Comp. time or paid time?
6. A great deal of my time has been spent on meetings and planning with the Council Committee on Future

Concerns. The committee has been meeting weekly since July Council Meeting. I commend Denise Bailey, Olga deBloom, George Nassner and John Williams for their dedication and hard work, and we all thank Denise for her time in copying material, especially the "doves" for September 10th service. I have also done research and extra worship preparation for this project. We have ALL grown spiritually during this time.

7. I am working with Membership Chairperson (Cass Young) to invite people to meet with me about membership. Cas is drawing up a list and I will be sending letters out about membership/Sunday School to those I have married and baptized.
8. I ask that you make an extra effort to meet Marie Jefferson, a new member who will be received in October. I would like to bring her to the worship service along with Tammy Loving, who will begin the process of membership class. Tammy has not been confirmed. Her husband, Steven Loving, and his parents, Carolyn and Dick, are certain that he is a member, however the records indicate that he needs to be reinstated. How does Council wish to handle this?

baptisms) premarital sessions, wedding rehearsal, conferences with bereaved families, and funerals.

Mr. ^{John} Gray, a longtime member, will have his service tomorrow at 11:30 AM. I have been meeting with his widow, Millie. Ernest Miller's service was last week.

Rhonda Ludwig's wedding rehearsal is this Fri. evening, with the wedding Saturday at 12:30.

I have also sent out 69 cards this month, since our last council meeting. There have been many people who have been ill or who had surgery, please keep them in your prayers. I think I have called on all people that I was aware of, who had a need, including calling on people during the week, on Friday - my day off, and on Saturday, my sermon preparation day at home. I have also taken communion to those who wanted it.

- Home Devotionals for shut-ins have been completed.
- Community Groups - I gave the morning program at the Hatten Center Oct. 30th.
I have been active in SEARCH with Pastor George.
- Happily worked with Frank, Olga and others on Sour Beef Dinner - I particularly enjoyed not only seeing how hard all the members and their families worked, but the friends of members! Great job!
- Other routine pastoral duties, such as working with Cass and Darlene, writing, working with lectors, planning, phoning, ecumenical meetings, pastor's study meetings, handling mail, passing information to appropriate people etc
- I ask permission to be gone January 13, and Sunday, January 14, for a study workshop in Philadelphia on planning/communicating.

Whoever is at the joint practice will then sing in the joint choir - no extra practices - as the music that will be chosen will be easy.

REQUEST OF COUNCIL TO HOST INTERFAITH MUSIC EVENT

After discussion at the October 25th SEARCH (Canton Ministerial) meeting,

On behalf of United Evangelical Church, pending United Council's approval at the November 14, 2000 Council meeting, I proposed that:

United Evangelical Church host an INTERFAITH LENTEN MUSICAL EVENING on a Wednesday Night as part of our Lenten Evening Schedule to BENEFIT THE FOOD BANK

I am suggesting a date in the middle of Lent, such as Wednesday, March 14th or March 21st or 28th.

Ash Wednesday is February 28. April 8th is Palm Sunday, and April 11th would be the Last Supper Tableau presentation.

Easter is April 15th

The first Sunday in Lent is March 4.

The first Wednesday in the Lenten Series would be March 7th, followed by March 14, 21, 28, and April 4.

I think it would be better to have it earlier, rather than later.

Therefore, I would suggest March 14th, 2001, with the 21st as an alternative in case of bad weather.

The discussion at the minister's meeting suggested that it

- 1) not be long (from 7:00 - 8:00 PM maximum—with refreshments from 8:00 to 8:30 PM down in Fellowship Hall)
- 2) It not be elaborate - no tickets, booklets or programs etc. no long talks, no politicians etc. (except for short introduction by me or the new pastor - an explanation of the purpose of bringing food and free will offering for Food Bank)

- Teaching and working with our fine Confirmation Class.
- Thank you to all the staff, Cass Young, Darlene Waters, Art Jones^{and Lois Jones} for all that they do this time of year.
- I ask permission to take 4 or 5 vacation days Thursday, December 28th returning Wednesday late morning Wednesday, Jan. 3rd 2001. Deacon Max Hoffman will preach at the one service on New Year's Eve morning at 10:AM. He will also preach January 14, as I am gone for the week-end for study leave.

May you all have a blessed Christmas as we anticipate working together in the Spirit of Christ during the New Year.
