### JOHN STEPHEN FAIR

The Reverend John Stephen Fair, son of John and Shirley Fair, was born on March 3, 1956 in Baltimore, Maryland. He attended public schools in Baltimore graduating in 1974 from the Baltimore Polytechnic Institute.

Stephen attended Towson State University where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Philosophy and Religion. At Towson he was a past secretary and president of the Christian Student Movement.

During his high school years he earned the Eagle Scout degree in Scouting and was a former Chaplain and Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop #151, St. Luke's Evangelical Lutheran Church of Baltimore where Stephen was once a member. He was a former president of the Hampden-Woodberry-Remington Christian Fellowship, an ecumenical community organization.

He was married on June 21st, 1980 to Kathryn Elizabeth Barrans Fair. Kathy is a graduate of Peabody Preparatory School, and of Towson State University where she earned her B.A. in Music Education.

In May of 1981, Stephen was awarded the Master of Divinity degree from Lancaster Theological Seminary, Lancaster, Pennsylvania. During his years at the seminary, Stephen was involved as a student intern at Trinity UCC, Hanover, Pa.; First & St. Stephen's UCC, Baltimore, Md.; and Faith UCC, Lancaster Pa. He also served as the Interim Pastor for Protestant Community UCC for a period in 1979.

Stephen and Kathy will be moving to Xenia, Ohio where he has been called to be the pastor of Byron United Church of Christ beginning June 7, 1981.

The stoles which Stephen will receive tonight are a gift of the congregation of First & St. Stephen's U.C.C.

The Bible used in the Service of Ordination is a gift from the members of the Consistory.
