

November 25, 1984

The annual Congregational meeting of the United Evangelical Church was called to order on Sunday, November 25, 1984 at 11:40 a.m. President Tuerk presiding.

Mr. Tuerk presented the agenda.

1. The reading of the minutes from two previous Congregational meetings.
2. The election of candidates to the Church Council.
3. Consideration of the 1985 Church budget.

The secretary read the minutes from the two previous Congregational meetings. They were approved as read.

Mr. Tuerk informed the congregation of the following:

1. The cost to the Church to select a new minister, including telephone calls totaled \$2,435.00, not including the moving of household goods of Pastor Fair from Xenia, Ohio to Baltimore. The moving expense will be \$1,470.00. Pastor Fair saved the church \$350.00 because they are doing their own packing.

2. Pastor Fair will arrive at the church tomorrow, November 26th. His wife will come to Baltimore on December 20th. Pastor Fair will return to Ohio on the 16th of December and return with his wife and the movers. His son will be with Pastor Fair when he arrives and will live with his grandparents.
