Lehmann, a minister, dies at 81

West Philadelphia, Pa. (Special)—Funeral services for the Rev. Titus Lehmann, former pastor of the United Evangelical Church in the Canton section of Baltimore, will be held at 2 P.M. Tuesday at the Karmel United Church of Christ, West Philadelphia.

Dr. Lehmann, who was 81, died Thursday at the Osteopathic Hospital in Philadelphia after being ill for several weeks.

A graduate of Elmhurst College, Elmhurst, Ill., he studied for the ministry at Eden Theological Seminary. He held a number of pastorates in United Church of Christ parishes before going to Baltimore in 1934.

Pastor for 27 years

That year he became pastor of the United Evangelical Church, East avenue and Dillon street, and remained in that post for 27 years. He became pastor emeritus in 1961, preaching occasionally and visiting the sick, elderly and the families of the parish.

He retired completely in 1965 and moved to Lansdowne, Pa.

Survivors include his wife, the former Irene Seybold; a daughter, Mrs. Quentin Flickinger, of Lansdowne, and six grandchildren.

Titus Lehmann, D.D.

Funeral services were held at the Karmel United Church of Christ in W. Philadelphia, Pa. on Tuesday for Titus Lehmann, D.D., who served in the ministry for 59 years, and was pastor at United Evangelical Church on East Ave. from 1934 until he retired in 1961.

Pastor Lehmann spent his boyhood in Baltimore, then graduated from the Elmhurst College in Illinois, and Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Mo. Before coming to Baltimore he served in parishes in Texas, Ohio, New York State, Missouri and Indiana.

He also worked with the United Church of Christ in writing Sunday school material and was instrumental in forwarding the program which built the Sunday school building, the new parsonage and the new church on East Ave., which was dedicated in 1957. He was Pastor Emeritus there until 1961 and retired in 1965 when he and Mrs. Lehmann moved to Lansdowne, Pa.

Besides his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Ruth Flickinger and six grandchildren.

Services for Dr. Titus Lehmann, former pastor of the United Evangelical Church in Canton, will be conducted 2 p.m. Tuesday in Philadelphia.

Dr. Lehmann, who was 81, died Thursday in a Philadelphia area hospital following a length illness.

He was senior pastor and pastor emeritus at the United Evangelical Church, United Church of Christ, from 1934/1961. The church is located at East Ave. and Dillon St. in Canton.

He attended Elmhurst College and the Eden Theological Seminary prior to serving 59 years in the ministry.

Survivors include his widow, the former Irene Seybold, a daughter and six grandchildren.
