

October 6, 1987

The regular monthly meeting of the Church Council of the United Evangelical Church was held on Tuesday, October 6, 1987, President, Mr. William Voelker, presiding.

All were present except for Mr. Art Jones, Mr. Lou Parker, and Mr. Jim Tallegesen.

The minutes from the previous meeting were read. One correction was made. The total cost of the Air Conditioner will be \$14,490. There was also one change to the previous minutes. There will be oysters served at the sour beef and oyster supper.

The financial report was approved as read. Mr. Voelker suggested putting the status of the Air Conditioner fund in the Sunday Bulletin to show the congregation where we are to date. Also, it was found that Social Security made a mistake on Millie Schlecta's 1985 statement. This will be corrected.
