

June 7, 1988

Finance

The phones were purchased for \$104.47

We recieved the \$5000 from the estate and \$1800 from the bull roast.

Property

The air conditioners are working now. We still owe \$4610.00

One of the firepots inside the boiler needs to be rebricked. The other furnace is in bad shape. The whole job will run about \$7000 in Mrs. Fader's estimation. There is a new boiler system that is being investigated by Mr. Bauersfeld. This would cost between \$35000 and \$50000. Mr. Bauersfeld will talk to Mr. Tallagsen. The Tate Engineering Company was suggested.

Mr. Bill Gross may be able to get us a better deal on the oil for the furnace in the parsonage.

The Friendship Hall will be painted.

Pastor Fair installed the air conditioner in the parsonage himself. The one in the bedroom doesn't work. We may need to get a new one for that room. A motion was made by Mrs. Gundlach and seconded by Mrs. Daniloski to purchase the new air conditioner if needed. The motion passed.

There was a problem with the girl scouts Monday night. There was a mess in the bathroom and they did not straighten the tables in the hall. Millie Schlecta called the leader and wrote her a letter. If this behavior continues, we will ask them to find a new meeting place.

A suggestion was made to send a form letter to members to see if they are still interested.
