Led by Dr. Mary Mikhael, former President of the Near East School of Theology in Beirut, Lebanon More than 1.5 million Syrians are seeking refuge both inside and outside Syria's borders from the spreading civil war that has brought violence and bloodshed to virtually every part of the country. Many of those fleeing are Christians, says the Rev. Nuhad Tomeh, the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s regional liaison for Syria, Lebanon, Iraq and the Persian Gulf region and an associate general secretary of the Middle East Council of Churches. The internal conflict began in spring 2011 and revolves around Syrians' discontent with the long-ruling Ba'ath Party and the leadership of Bashar al-Assad. 
"When I visited my mother in Syria I was astonished at how many families host other families despite their own needs," says Mary Mikhael, former president of the Near East School of Theology in Beirut, Lebanon's capital. "Many churches are involved in relief work, helping the displaced even with limited resources." A number of the displaced women Mikhael has encountered speak of the lack of basics and of high prices for what is available. "Indeed the future seems dark for all of us," she says. Yet at the same time the women say they would stay hungry in order to achieve peace, security and hope for their children

The majority of their plants are grown from seed, using local sources as much as possible. They believe that plants grown from seeds collected in local or nearby populations will be better adapted to our soils, our climate, and our ecosystems. If you require specific information about a particular plant, they will be happy to provide more detail. They also grow a small number of native plant cultivars due to their appeal to retail customers and their suitability for urban landscapes. Most of these cultivars are propagated through cuttings or division, though some cultivars will grow "true" from seed. Most of their woody plants are grown in 1, 2, or 3 gallon containers that you can fit into a sedan and plant easily. Their heights vary from 1 to 5 ft. Their trees vary in size from a gallon container that is two feet tall to a ten gallon 10' tall 'Princeton' American elm (*Ulmus americana*).

Raise The Federal Minimum Wage Sunday...TODAY! If the 1968 federal minimum wage rose with inflation, it would be \$10.67 today. If it rose with worker productivity, it would be \$22 today. Today it stands at a miserly \$7.25. As a result, thirty million

Americans are making less per hour today, adjusted for inflation, than workers made 45 years ago in 1968. In an age where Forbes 25 CEOs rake in more in an hour than a minimum wage worker does in a year, this is disrespectful and unacceptable. Fortunately, there's a bill in Congress called the "The Catching Up to 1968 Act" that would raise the minimum wage back to \$10.50 and index it to rise with the cost of living. 
Help Build a Recycled Bottle Fence for the "I Wonder Garden" at the Friendship Academy of Science and Technology (FAST)... FAST (801 S. Highland Ave.) is growing a special place in the back lot of its school in Baltimore. They call it the "I Wonder Garden," named after a small park that existed a few blocks away near the harbor in the early 1900s. Here students and members of the community are replacing 7,000 sq. ft. of pavement with native plants, raised beds, flowers, and places to learn outside. This patch of green will be where young minds ask about how nature works and where students discover new insights about themselves and their world. The garden will also help heal the environment.
