Meeting of the Committee was held on Tuesday, September 11, 1979 at 7:30 a.m. in the Choir Room.

All committee members brought helpful suggestions to the meeting. All organizations of United are once again participating in the supper.

Some of the outstanding decisions made at the meeting were:

1. Left overs will be left up to the Chairperson to dispose of as she sees rightly to do.
2. Tickets for the people who helped with the supper, to be done away with. Anyone who helped is entitled to a free meal.
3. Make sure the help has definite duties to perform, not at a loss for something to do.

4. Stress the need for more help from the younger people of the Church. Confirmation class and their parents.
5. Have more involvement of the Youth Group.
6. Have all helpers who have cooked all day, and helped serve the food to leave the kitchen area after the last patron has left, and then let the clean up crew take over the kitchen.
7. Have an adult supervisor to oversee the clean up operation.
8. We will use white paper cloths on the tables this year due to the high cost of laundry last year.
9. Styrofoam cups will be used this year in place of china cups and saucers, to help cut the dishwashing problem. 9 oz. size.
10. Have the waitresses help to set the table, clear the table, and have the coffee and tea pourers to help the waitresses wherever possible.

A letter of invitation to attend the Luncheon - Supper was sent to The Exchange Club of Highlandtown by our Church Secretary, Millie Sletcha.

Also 25 copies of a letter to all local radio and TV stations was sent out by our Church Secretary.

Inventory was taken of the Council cupboard and also of last year's food ordering form, and all perishables were ordered on September 20, 1979 by Claire Hengen, Margout Myrick, and Millie Sletcha.

3 lbs. of McCormick pickling spices was donated to the church by Mr. & Mrs. William Voelker.

The 1979 Low Beef & Oyster Supper went very well this year. New ideas were tried such as paper table cloths, styfoam cups, more participation from the younger members of the Church, and also a clean-up crew with an adult supervisor. All of these ideas were tried and proved to be very helpful in the overall task of the supper. Also a meat slicer was lent to the Church by Mr. Fred Sturm, which proved to be most efficient in the slicing of the beef. Maybe the Church could purchase one of it's own for future suppers. The only problem areas that were encountered this year were we needed more help from the men to move pots for the ladies. Most of our men work during the day or are retired, (semi-retired), and should not be lifting heavy pots. It was ^{even} suggested at the Committee Meeting that we might pay someone to do it. But in trying to hold expenses down, we did not. Maybe in the future the Church will have to pay someone to do it. Also Footies Produce did not deliver when they were suppose to. The Church Secretary, Millie Slechta, kept calling to find out what the hold up was. They were suppose to deliver before 10:00 a.m, but did not come until 11:30 a.m. This caused a problem because the help was there and ready to work, but the vegetables weren't. Maybe if we asked for delivery before 9:00 a.m or even the day before, we can be sure there will be no delays in the preparation of the meal.

The financial part I do not know. I believe there is still money coming in. I do know that I was given \$600.00 in advance, and I returned \$136.94 to Mr. Randy Schmitt. Also

two one hundred dollar checks were made out to Mrs. Smith's Pies. It was not all used for Pies, the remainder of both checks the Church Secretary kept and paid for two special trash pick-ups with.

A complete report is in the file cabinet of the Church Office, and available to anyone wishing to read it. It is filed under Suppers.



