

WEEK OF PRAYER SERVICE HERE




MAUNDY THURSDAY

There can be no separation between the Last Supper and the Crucifixion. The first explains the second, and the second validates the first. It was at the supper that Jesus took the bread and broke it, took the cup and poured it out; it was on the cross that the nails were driven and the spear was thrust. And without the supper the disciples would not have understood the cross; without the cross they would not have believed the supper.

“This is my body, which is broken for you . . . This is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.” There can be no separation between the Last Supper and the Crucifixion because they both bear witness to the same divine event. The one was the briefing session, the final rehearsal, the mock battle; the other was the real encounter, the actual engagement, the ultimate commitment of forces. The one was a sign; the other was the signified. But both affirm God’s invasion of history. Both proclaim the Word made flesh. Both show forth God so loving the people of his creation that he dwelt among them in his Son, suffered death for their sake and transformed a simple meal and an instrument of execution into pledges of that power and grace which would abide with them forever.

Perhaps another meditated: "I think I know what it means. Jesus died for my sins. He took the punishment I deserved. I'm saved by his blood."


And another: "Today the battle is won. Death and the demonic powers have met their match. Great is the victory!"

CANTON DAILY VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL BEGINS TOMORROW - HERE AT 9 A.M.




