This Order of Worship is a very near duplication of the Order for the Lord's Day service as suggested by our United Church of Christ. It is requested you follow the bulletin closely, participating at those points where so requested, remembering from Sunday to Sunday these new procedures.

(1)The Amens - the congregation and choir will sing the 'Amens' during the service. In almost every instance the words preceding the 'Amen' will be, "through Jesus Christ our Lord."

(2)The Versicles - following the Assurance of Pardon and prior to the Intercessory Prayers, the congregation will sing the response after the pastor's sentence of praise.

(3)The Collect - the Collect, or brief prayer immediately before the reading of the Scripture will be a new feature for us. The Collect will be offered from the Lectern.

(4)The Scripture Readings - we shall include the Old Testament reading as well as the readings from the Epistle and Gospel.

Congregation will stand immediately after the Epistle Reading, the Gospel location will be announced, then the Gloria Tibi will be sung. After the Gospel is concluded the Laus Tibi will be sung. The congregation will remain standing until the Pastor moves to the Pulpit and has given the Ascription prior to the Sermon, then will be seated.

(5)The Intercessory Prayers - these come after the Sermon and are composed of a series of brief prayers, broken into sections. Following each section the congregation sings an "Amen" for that section.
