ROMAN CATHOLIC CARDINAL IN U.C. PULPIT

"We've got to get all this ecumenical spirit out of the hands of the scholars and get it down to the grassroots," Richard Cardinal Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, declared from the pulpit of our First Church on the Green, New Haven, Conn. The Cardinal addressed a "Festival of Faith" attended by some 700 Protestant and Catholic clergy and laity. Speaking for an hour and a half on the recently - concluded Vatican Council, the Cardinal said that, while he did not believe all Christian groups would ever achieve organic unity, they should strive for unity of love....."In this unity of love we can be united for the common good of countries, for the betterment of city and country, and for universal peace."



CHURCH SCHOOL

Administration

To serve as an officer of the Church School, which officers are Superintendent, Treasurer, Secretary of various kinds, Finance Officer. _____

Superintendent of Department

To combine the job of teaching with that of being in charge of a department in the church School. _____

Pianist

To serve in one of the departments in the Church School as the accompanist for departmental singing. _____

Department Secretary

To keep the attendance records of a department regularly each week; to receive the offerings and take them to the Church School Office, and to help otherwise, when asked to do so. _____

Teacher

To give of time and talent in one of the departments of the Church School as a teacher of a class. _____

Audio-Visual Attendant

To be trained to assist in the work of using audio-visual aids in the various departments and to serve as a member and worker in the Audio-Visual Department. _____

Men's Senior Bible Class

To meet with this class on Sundays at 9:00 A.M. for study of the Bible. _____

CHOIRS

Member of the Choir(s)

To give one's talents to sing the praise of God; to attend rehearsals regularly and to sing regularly on the Lord's Day.

Senior Choir (15 years and above) _____

Youth Choir (Confirmation to 15) _____

Cherub Choir (6 years to 12) _____

Accompanist

To assist the organist as accompanist, especially for the Youth Choir rehearsals, and to serve at other times when the choirs might need accompaniment. _____

Librarian

To assist regularly in the keeping of the music files in order; to assist in the care of robes and other choir materials. _____

Choir Parent

To assist in the governance of the Youth and Cherub Choirs - at rehearsals and at other times - and to serve the choirs as a person especially interested in their betterment.

WORSHIP SERVICE ASSISTANCE

Sunday Nursery Attendant

To be willing to attend and care for small children during services on Sunday so that their parents can attend church.

Usher

To be willing to be trained as an usher for the morning services, and to serve under the direction of the head or assistant usher.

Transportation

To regularly stop-by (under direction, or request of the Pastor or Officer of Church) at the home of an aged person or a semi-invalid and to bring them to church service -- then returning them home after service.

Greeter

To serve, under direction of the Council, as official greeter at one of the church doors prior to the worship service' to officially greet all who come to the services, spot visitors, make them welcome and request they sign our Guest Book.
(Women, as well as men, can serve in this manner).

Altar Committee

To assist in decorating and furnishing the altar in the church with the various paraments, especially at Christmas and Easter.

VISITATION

Visitor to Shut-Ins

To give time on Sunday afternoons, or in evening, to visit the shut-ins of the church, as a messenger of fellowship from the church; this to be done in a regular manner, under direction of the Pastor or the Church Council.

Visitor under Membership Committee

To assume responsibility of calling on folk of the church whom the committee may desire calls to be made upon, and to call upon others who may be interested in church membership; to be willing for training in this joy of calling.

Visitor with Tape Recorder

To take a tape recorder and a tape of the morning worship service to the homes of shut-ins and sick, and to play the tape of the service to them.

Visitor with Flowers

To give time on Sunday afternoons to take flowers from altar to the sick. (There are usually two bouquets to be taken to sick/shut-ins.

Use of car at special times

To provide car at Thanksgiving and Christmas to distribute baskets of food to families in need, under direction of Spiritual Committee; and, to provide use of car at Easter time to distribute Easter lilies to shut-ins.

CHURCH OFFICE

Work in Church Office

Work in the matter of simple record keeping, assisting in various office duties, during office hours, and, occasionally during evening hours, under direction of Church Secretary.

Typing

Willingness to give to the office your services to do typing (we have the typewriters) during office hours.

Assisting in mailing "Endeavor"

To be part of a group who, on call from the Church Secretary, will put "Endeavor" mailing in order for mailing (usually monthly, on a particular night).

SOCIAL SERVICES

Gown Repair

To assist in repairing choir gowns, when the need arises.

Sewing for Others

To spend a day at the church regularly (once a week) in sewing for needy (making dresses, etc. from simple patterns); sewing of various kits, etc.
