And when they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left. And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:33, 34)

After this Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the scripture), "I thirst." A bowl full of vinegar stood there; so they put a sponge full of the vinegar on hyssop and held it to His mouth. When Jesus had received the vinegar, He said, "It is finished"; and He bowed His head and gave up His spirit. (John 19:28-30)

To prove the power, the majesty, and the fullness of His victory of the New Covenant, the Lord and His attendants, the executioners, fulfilled every detail foretold by the Old Covenant. The sponge and the vinegar realize the words ". . . for My thirst they gave Me vinegar to drink" (Psalm 69:21).
