To Be Of Greater Usefulness To The Church

Global Ministries missionary Lawrence Gilley serves as principal of the Kalahari Desert School of Theology, an educational ministry of Moffat Mission in Kuruman, South Africa. He writes about his relationship as teacher/pastor with a lay leader from a nearby congregation.

"I became Peter Baakawanya's 'moruti' (teacher/pastor) because he was a student in the Christian Leadership Course which forms a key element of the program of the Kalahari Desert School of Theology. Participation in the course has been important to him in his understanding of the faith and his fulfillment of his leadership role in the Mothibistad Congregational Church, one of 24 congregations that make up the Seodin Circuit.

"Peter's requests for help are diverse. Sometimes he wants help finding a reference for a story or teaching which he remembers, but not where it is located in the Bible. Since I often don't know, too, I get a chance to introduce Peter to the usefulness of a concordance. Sometimes he wants help with figuring out what to preach at some unusual gathering — an awkward funeral, a family observance, or a secular meeting. My first response is usually, 'Peter, have you read the lessons for that day in the lectionary?' We read and discuss them together and he discovers 'That's just the right message, Moruti.' Sometimes he needs help understanding and explaining a passage, so we go to the library and find the commentaries or Bible dictionaries and we read together.

"Peter started studying theology this year, as if he did not have more than enough to do with his work, family, community and church responsibilities. By learning more, he says, he will be of greater usefulness to the church."

And I vowed always to be here.







The UCC Disaster Response office has sent our church information concerning the horrible earthquake in El Salvador.

A 15-person work group from the Catocin Association was in neighboring Honduras when the quake occurred rebuilding homes destroyed by Hurricane Floyd, and they will be back this week-end with more information about the earthquake.

The death toll from the massive earthquake is estimated to exceed 1,000 persons with many still missing. Strong aftershocks continue to heighten fears and hinder rescue efforts. Over 6,000 homes were destroyed, 17,000 homes damaged with new reports still coming in.

Action by Churches Together, and international alliance of more than 200 churches and church based aid agencies, including One great Hour of Sharing – United Church of Christ - has sent an initial grant of \$50,000 from its Rapid Response Fund for food, medicine, blankets, plastic sheeting and other relief items.

ACT is expected to issue an appeal of around US\$3 million later this week to support the strong group of ACT partners in the country, that includes the two Disciples partner churches, the Lutheran Church of El Salvador and the Emmanuel Baptist Church, along with Lutheran World Service – El Salvador, CREDHO (Episcopal) and the Reformed Church (Presbyterian) of El Salvador. A special fund account has been opened to receive designated contributions for the earthquake.

If you feel led to contribute, please make your check out to EL SALVADOR EARTHQUAKE, put it in the offering plate, and the office will forward it to the Conference Office of the UCC. Please pray for these unfortunate sisters and brothers.

Global Ministries missionary Angela Balfour serves in the office of the General Secretary of the United Congregational Church of Southern Africa. She shares a learning from her early weeks there.

"Since I've been in the Republic of South Africa, I have had the opportunity to meet more than my fair share of truly wonderful people who have gone out of their way to make me feel not just comfortable, but wanted. African hospitality is alive and well in the RSA. What I've found most interesting, and the lesson that God continually teaches me through the process of acclimatization, is that everything has its season."

"When I first arrived, I was incredibly frustrated because I wanted everything to happen at once. I wanted my apartment so that I wouldn't have to live with someone else; my car so that I could get around on my own and wouldn't have to depend on anyone; my furniture so that I could create what I felt was comfortable living space, my job description. . . ."

"One by one, I got the things I was looking for, but in the process I learned a lesson about letting go and trusting God. It took a month for me to find an apartment, but when I did it was everything I wanted with a few extras. . . . It took a month and a half to get a car, but in the process I was able to get to know both my supervisor and the office administrator better through our conversations during the morning drive. . . . What a joy it is to be able to let go of the need to create the world in our image and to open ourselves to the blessings of the world God has already created."

"Life is about the journey, not the destination, and that journey is made meaningful by our willingness to be open to God's blessings that come in odd ways and different times and through the grace of the people he places in our lives."




George Nassner grew up in this church and is now the President of our Church Council. He teaches the Adult Bible Class on Sunday mornings and has been in the Tableau for two years.

ORDER FOR THE TENEBRAE

The name Tenebrae (the Latin word for "darkness" or "shadows") has for centuries been applied to ancient monastic services held during the last three days of Holy Week.

The extinguishing of the candles symbolizes the coming of death to Jesus and the descent of darkness upon the world, to be released only by the glorious resurrection on Easter.

All lights in the church will be extinguished until only the Christ Candle, symbolizing the eternal light of God, remains. Toward the end of the service this candle is hidden, typifying the apparent victory of the forces of evil.

At the very end, a loud noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the time of the resurrection.

The Christ Candle is now restored to its place and by its light all depart in silence.

(L) Let us begin the story of the last days of Christ on earth.

P) Jesus first instituted "The Last Supper" with his followers the night he was arrested. After they had sung the last hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives where Jesus prayed to the Father: "Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

(L) Stay awake and pray, that you may not enter into the time of trial. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

The First Candle is Extinguished

(P) And Jesus said, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to the point of death; remain here, and watch with me. Now you shall see the crowd who will surround me; you will flee, and I will go to be offered up for you."

(L) Behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. You will flee, and I will go to be offered up for you.

The Second Candle is Extinguished

(P) Lo, we have seen him without beauty or majesty; with no looks to attract our eyes. He bore our sins and grieved for us, he was wounded for our transgression, and by his scourging we are healed.

(L) Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; and by his scourging we are healed.

The Third Candle is Extinguished

(P) The kings of the earth rise up in revolt, and the princes plot together, against the Lord and against his Anointed. They divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing. False witnesses have risen up against me, and also those who speak malice.

(L) They divide my garments among them. They cast lots for my clothing.

The Fourth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) And Jesus said "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs to capture me? Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me; but now, behold, you scourge me, and lead me away to be crucified."**
- (L) When they had laid hands on Jesus and were holding him, he said: "Day after day I sat in the temple teaching, and you did not seize me: but now, behold, you scourge me, and lead me away to be crucified."

The Fifth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) Darkness covered the whole land when Jesus had been crucified: and about the ninth hour he cried with a loud voice: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" and he bowed his head and handed over his spirit.**
- (L) Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit. And he bowed his head and handed over his spirit."

The Sixth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) See how the righteous one perishes, and no one takes it to heart. The righteous are taken away, and no one understands. From the face of evil the righteous one is taken away, and his memory shall be in peace.**
- (L) Like a sheep before its shearers is mute, so he opened not his mouth. By oppression and judgment he was taken away: and his memory shall be in peace.

The Seventh Candle is Extinguished

- (P) I was like a trusting lamb led to the slaughter. I did not know it was against me that they devised schemes, saying, "Let us destroy the tree with its fruit; let us cut him off from the land of the living."**
- (L) All my enemies whispered together against me, and devised evil against me, saying: "let us destroy the tree with its fruit; Let us cut him off from the land of the living."

The Eighth Candle is Extinguished

- (P) The veil of the temple was torn in two, and the earth shook, and the thief from the cross cried out, "Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom."**
- (L) The rocks were split, the tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who slept were raised: and the earth shook, and the thief from the cross cried out, "Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

The Ninth Candle is Extinguished

(P) When the Lord was buried, they sealed the tomb, rolling a great stone to the door of the tomb, and they stationed soldiers to guard him.

(L) The chief priests gathered before Pilate and petitioned him: And they stationed soldiers to guard him.

The Tenth Candle is Extinguished

(P) God did not spare his own Son, but delivered him up for us all.

(L) He was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and he opened not his mouth.

The Eleventh Candle is Extinguished

(P) They shall mourn for him as one mourns for an only child; for the Lord, who is without sin, is slain.

The Twelfth Candle is Extinguished

(P) From the gates of hell, O Lord, deliver my soul.

(L) In my despair I said, "In the noonday of my life I must depart: my unspent years are called to the portals of death."

"No more shall I see the Lord in the land of the living, never more look on my kind among dwellers on earth."

"Between sunrise and sunset my life is brought to an end; I cower and hope for the dawn."

"From the gates of hell, O Lord, deliver my soul."

The Last Candle is Extinguished

(P) O death, I will be your death; O grave, I will be your destruction.

(L) My flesh also shall rest in hope: you will not let your Holy One see corruption.


(P) Now the women sitting at the tomb made lamentation, weeping for the Lord.

(P) Christ for us became obedient to the point of death-- even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the Name which is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend.

The Stripping of the Chancel by the Acolytes

(L) Almighty God, we pray you to behold graciously this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross.

*Observing the discipline of Silence, and with soft music playing, the lights will be brought up to a dim position. **Let us all now depart in SILENCE.** All talking is delayed until the congregation is outside the Church Building.*


UNITED STATES AIR FORCE




