
Re: AN INVITATION TO GATHER, REFLECT, PRAY AND SHARE

Reflections of the Rev. John H. Thomas,
General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ

Tuesday, September 11, 2001

My first trip to Berlin, part of an ecumenical visit to church partners in Germany, Switzerland, and Hungary, was already rich with personal and historical association. Berlin is where many of the defining political events of my generation took place—the Berlin airlift, the Wall, the beginning of reunification and the end of the Cold War. Here is where my father-in-law served the American Church in Berlin during the dramatic years of the 1930's. To stay at a church run hotel called the "Dietrich Bonhoeffer-Haus" was, itself, to be reminded of a key part of the Christian story in the 20th century.

Peter Makari, Area Executive for the Middle East and Europe of the Common Global Ministries Board, and I began the morning of September 11 on a drive with Bill and Sabine Downey, retired Associates of the United Church Board for World Ministries who had done pastoral work in Berlin in the 1970's, 80's, and 90's. The Downey's drove us out of the city past the Brandenburg Gate, along a street that once housed many of the Nazi ministries and the famous Tempelhof Airport, past the former site of the Gestapo headquarters, and by one of the few remaining remnants of the Wall. Our journey took us to Frankfurt on the Oder, a former Hanseatic city on what is now the Polish border in part of what once was the German Democratic Republic. There we visited Lisa and Steve Smith and their son David, missionaries of the Common Global Ministries Board who are serving a parish of the Evangelical Church in Berlin-Brandenburg, one of the regional churches of the Evangelical Church of the Union, our partner in "Kirchengemeinschaft" since 1981. Our visit also included a special gathering of church leaders and press to present an Award of Affirmation to Dr. Rolf Wischnath, General Superintendent of the Cottbus Region of the Berlin-Brandenburg Church. Dr. Wischnath was to have received his award at the General Synod/Assembly in July, but had been ill and unable to travel.

The Award recognized Dr. Wischnath's decisive leadership role in opposing the violence perpetrated by right wing hate groups against asylum seekers and ethnic minorities. He is president of the Brandenburg Action Alliance Against Violence and is well known in church and society for his commitment. The Award ceremony was well attended by the press, and Dr. Wischnath used this festive occasion to draw public attention to the plight of two Kosovar families being threatened with deportation by the state.

As toasts were exchanged at a closing reception, one of the reporters returned, shaken, to inform us of the unfolding catastrophe in New York and Washington. Dr. Wischnath led our group in prayer and then accompanied us to the television station where staff made provision for us to watch the coverage of the terrorist attacks and call colleagues in Cleveland. Reporters interviewed me for their own radio and television coverage, barely able to control their own emotions. These members of a profession often caricatured as callous and insensitive, sent us on our way back to Berlin with embraces of consolation and care. And Dr. Wischnath, who we had come to honor for his prophetic ministry, became our pastor in a parting blessing. Together

with the Smith's and their pastoral colleagues, this was for me a profound moment of partnership.

Upon our return to Berlin at eight in the evening we were met by Friedrich Demke, ecumenical officer of the Evangelical Church of the Union in Berlin, informing us that we were asked to participate in a hastily called ecumenical vigil to be held at the Berliner Dom, the restored Protestant Cathedral, an event that would be hosted by the Bishop of the Evangelical Church of Berlin-Brandenburg, Wolfgang Huber, and the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Berlin, Cardinal Sterzinsky. Several thousand Berliners filled the church and spilled out into the damp, chilly streets. The leaders of the major political parties, the mayor of Berlin, and the Federal Justice Minister joined ordinary Berliners to sing and pray. I was welcomed as a church partner and as a kind of representative of the American people in this remarkable outpouring of grief, tears, and consolation. As the Cardinal, Bishop, and I moved from the sanctuary to the crowd outside, we were met by hundreds of mostly young people, singing songs for peace, a moment made significant and poignant by the fact that one of the songs was in Hebrew, another was our own "We Shall Overcome." Countless strangers took my hand and said, "We are so sorry."

Our day ended as it did for many—sitting in front of television news, telephoning friends and family in the New York area to reassure ourselves of their well-being. But for Peter and me there was much more as we reflected on this incredible day. We had gone to a part of the world that many once feared would be the place World War III might begin, only to watch terrifying destruction in cities close to home.

We had come to express the support of the United Church of Christ and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to our partner church as it struggles with the largely atheistic, post-socialist context of the former East Germany, but instead we received the care of that church in the face of our own national tragedy. We came to honor the struggle against violence by courageous colleagues far from home, only to watch violence come home to us in painful, frightening, and intimate ways, and we learned that overcoming violence must be our own struggle as well. We woke up to a city heavy with ominous historical meaning; we went to bed embraced by Berliners gentle in their care and extravagant in their compassion. For all its horror, as yet not fully grasped, it was a graced day.

At the ecumenical service I offered this prayer.

May it be ours in the coming days:

Loving and eternal God, who promises to wipe away tears in a time without mourning or pain, you bring comfort and consolation to those who trust in you. Tonight we give thanks for this sign of companionship and consolation by the people of Berlin for the people of my own native land. We give thanks for this moment when the church is able to see beyond its own separation to the gift of its unity in Christ. Hear us now as we pray for those whose loved ones have died today, for those who struggle with pain and injury, for those who even now risk their lives to rescue others. Guide the leaders of the United States, and their colleagues around the world, that they may turn away from violence and vengeance, seeking the way that leads to reconciliation, justice, and hope. This we pray.

A Prayer that the Spirit Might Move Us All...

Global Ministries missionary Marla Schrader serves in the occupied West Bank. She wrote in June of the Palestinian reality and prayed that "the Spirit will move faster, bursting and blowing into all the hollow crevices of sorrow and loss, pain and humiliation, fear and brokenness that I witness every day."

"Within the Palestinian community, no one has remained unscarred. Everyone is suffering and daily feels their human rights being chipped away. Whether it be no milk and cooking fuel in Gaza, or no road open to the hospital in the West Bank. Most of you have heard the numbers: over 500 killed and almost 20,000 wounded, many of whom will be permanently disabled.

"The psychological trauma is just beginning to be talked about. A Birzeit University survey late last January revealed that 80% of adults from refugee camps reported signs of psychological problems in children within their households. Similar behavioral changes were reported in approximately two-thirds of non-refugee respondents. More than half the respondents reported sleeping disorders, fearfulness, lack of concentration, and violent behavior in their children.

"The Palestinian economy was in dire straits prior to the beginning of the second *intifada*. Now, after eight months of Israeli imposed siege, it is in shambles. . . .The median monthly income of Palestinian households has dropped by 48%. This means that currently over two million Palestinians, or almost two thirds of the population, now live below the poverty line.

"The current crisis is referred to in terms of tit-for-tat violence. And yet, there is no parity between an occupied people and an occupier. The structures of the Israeli military occupation are themselves inherently violent."

BEARING OUR GRIEF AND MAKING FOR PEACE:

A response from Justice and Witness Ministries of the United Church of Christ

The horrific terrorist attacks of Tuesday, September 11 were a hate-inspired crime against all humanity, leaving thousands dead and wounded, while millions around the world have been left to grieve under a heavy burden of shock, sorrow, anger, and fear.

The United Church of Christ, like so many other religious traditions, is beginning to learn more fully the direct impact of this tragedy on many of our own faith communities. Already, among the confirmed dead, are members of our UCC congregations. We already know that congregations in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Virginia, and the District of Columbia have experienced tremendous sorrow, as multiple families have experienced the death of family members and dear friends.

The UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries offers our prayers, solidarity, and financial gifts on behalf of those who have been victimized by these murderous deeds of destruction. We, like so many, are filled with an abiding, gnawing grief.

"We are all overwhelmed by the destruction caused by this profound act of hatred," said Bernice Powell Jackson, executive minister of Justice and Witness Ministries. "But we have hope from God to draw upon, the strength of one another, and our own personal and collective stories of overcoming tremendous struggle. We rely on the saving strength of God's grace."

Even in the midst of death and destruction, however, we are already witnessing incredible signs of love, hope, and resurrection. UCC members and congregations are responding with generous acts of kindness and charity, even while our pastors and lay leaders are helping us to individually name our deep sorrow and collectively share these heavy burdens. This, we must recognize, is part of the heroic work and healing of God.

Still, to be sure, this tragedy is a significant challenge to faith. It raises those timeless questions about the nature of evil and oftentimes damaging assumptions about God's will in the midst of suffering. Above all, we are invited to hear God's word of hope and allow faith and love to shape our response, even while our tempers may flare with anger and our imaginations may race with images of revenge. More than ever, we are called to reflect on why there is much hatred in the world against the United States and our policies.

At such times, we are reminded of Christ's shocking yet inspiring words: "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Creator in heaven." (Matthew 5:44-45) As our nation prepares for war in an effort to confront terrorism, we are challenged by Jesus' call for his followers to be peacemakers. Our own UCC tradition is filled with a profound history of peaceful resistance, as people of faith have sought to follow in the non-violent steps of our Lord. As Martin Luther King Jr. said, "Without justice, there is no peace." There are no easy answers, yet the call to faithfulness remains.

Unfortunately, violence has escalated even beyond the horror of that tragic Tuesday. As a nation readies for war, hate crimes against Arab-Americans, those perceived to be from the Middle East, and other people of color have risen at staggering rates.

According to the Council on American-Islamic Relations, the FBI and the Justice Department have begun investigating what Arab-American leaders describe as a wave of anti-Muslim violence—from a series of assaults in New York to shots fired at an Irving, Tex., mosque to the attempted burning of the Islamic Idriss Mosque in Seattle.

The Council on American-Islamic Relations reported 210 incidents of violence or threats of violence since the Tuesday morning attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon.

As you and your congregation wrestle with the events surrounding this national tragedy, Justice and Witness Ministries encourages you:

- To re-visit the basic tenets of our own faith and to ask the hard questions about the church's role as an agent of peace and reconciliation. In the United Church of Christ, in light of this tragedy, what does it mean to be a Just-Peace Church in times like these? We invite and welcome your responses to this difficult question.
- To advocate with government officials for more reasoned political solutions rather than relying solely on military responses.
- To explore the multiple dimensions of violence in our society and to discern ways for your congregation to address those systems that perpetuate violence in your community and the world: poverty and economic inequity, prejudice and racial injustice, stereotyping, scapegoating, and religious persecution. In July, the General Synod called upon all settings of the UCC to join in the National Decade to Overcome Violence.
- To discuss the dangers of fundamentalism in any faith and how it distorts the essential tenets of any religious tradition.
- To reach out in love and friendship to our Muslim brothers and sisters, as well as people of all faith traditions. Only through interfaith understanding and solidarity can true peace be established.
- To be a voice in your community against hate crimes.
- To learn more about Islam and the Middle East so that you might be an enlightened and compassionate voice in an increasing climate of religious hostility and racial prejudice.
- To discuss the differences between patriotism and nationalism, and to prayerfully consider how God's love and concern for all people calls us to look beyond national borders in the pursuit of justice and peace.
- To resist any movement to use this tragedy as the mechanism to promote racial hatred or to blame or scapegoat any group of people—or to advance opportunistic political agendas that unnecessarily escalate militarism and violence while ignoring other needs of people in this country and around the world.

Change Does Not Come Easily or Fast, But Attitudes Can Change.

Global Ministries missionary Helen Burgess is serving as a technical assistant in health programs for the Christian Commission for Development (CCD) in Tegucigalpa, Honduras. She writes of the power of sustained presence in the lives of Honduran villagers.

"In November we hosted a workshop on gender and religion. This is a difficult topic here as the churches, in general, are very conservative when it comes to women's roles, and in some areas we work with indigenous groups rather than the general Honduran population, and they are also more conservative. One of the issues we discussed in the workshop was the issue of women's health. CCD has done a campaign to get women to have Pap smears (tests for cervical cancer). The word for Pap smear that was used was very close to the Spanish word for surgery. Some poorly informed man reported to the priest in the community that we were encouraging women to get sterilized. Without any additional information, the priest preached a sermon that any women who went to have their Pap smears were assassins, going against the dictates of the Catholic Church, and that they would be denied any of the sacraments. Some very angry women in this community confronted the priest and told him he was wrong, and that they would have it done all the same, it was for their health.

"It takes courage to do this, and it was a nice illustration of how CCD can help bring about a change in attitudes in a community (mind you, we have been working there for more than a decade, but change does not come easily or fast). It was very exciting to hear this all reported by a Lenca woman at the workshop. She was loudly applauded, as you might imagine."
