One Great Hour of Sharing

The Church's essential unity was clearly evident at the close of the war. The world was a broken mass of humanity, with little cohesion anywhere. The Christian Church presented a united front.


Hardly had the guns ceased firing, when the Christian Church was closing the ranks of its believers, and former enemy and friendly countries were as one, setting their hands and hearts to the task of healing and binding up the wounds.

The Department of Reconstruction and Inter-Church Aid in Geneva actually antedated the formation of the World Council of Churches by several years. In giving and receiving countries, Councils of Churches were formed and, through them, united in Geneva, to give mutual assistance without asking for creedal identification. Nothing in the entire history of Christendom can compare with this magnificent witnessing to the power of the Spirit of God.

The end is not yet. The end shall never be, for we must continue to move onward and forward toward a world united in Christian love and fellowship, working creatively for a society in which hate, suspicion and fear will be replaced by love, trust and confidence.

There are endless evidences of such things happening in all parts of the world today. Nothing demonstrates that more adequately than the experience CIMADE had in its work among Germans in the French zone of Germany. CIMADE is a youth organization formed during the war to minister to evacuees. Since that initial purpose, it has enlarged its services and a recent mission was the setting up of conferences among German pastors in the French zone. The project was so successful that the Paris office was flooded with requests that the same be done all over Germany! There have been traditional forces that have kept the French and Germans apart and an endless number of wars have not brought them together. But the French and Germans are together wherever Christian acts of love are the means.

In this ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING today we can all, as Christians, give tangible evidence of our Christian faith in the triumph of love. The world is still far from healed. Much remains to be done. Our witness on this day will strengthen the purposes of those who must walk among the broken bits of humanity, but it will also give new reality to our own faith. May we give generously as we unite with Christians of all faiths on this day of sharing with our unfortunate fellow-Christians around the world. —Henry C. Koch


High-type music has its place in the growth of the Christian life. The Psalms have always formed the chief part of the praise of the Christian Church. Luther and other Reformers led the Church back to congregational singing. Versions of the Psalms were arranged so they could be sung. Luther led the way with his version of the 46th Psalm "A Mighty Fortress is our God." John Calvin placed Psalms in his early forms of worship. The Protestant exiles from Scotland took these back to their home country. And so the Scottish Psalter was on its way and thru the centuries has had a great influence upon the Church. Our congregation might take time to look up the References to hymns based on the Psalms in our own Hymnal on Page 626. We need to appreciate our heritage of fine hymns and use these.







"SIGNIFICANCE OF CHURCH COLORS"

The colors of our paraments on altar and other sacred furniture are symbolical of great truths and add to the dignity of the service. At present we have GREEN. This color stands for hope and life. It is used for hangings in the seasons of Epiphany and Trinity. Violet or PURPLE symbolizes penitence. Used in Advent, Pre-Lent and Lent. With penitence we make our hearts ready for the Christ. WHITE indicates purity, joy and bright light of truth. Used on all the great festivals of the Church and the Sundays after Easter. BLACK is used on Good Friday and stands for mourning. It is also used at funerals, although white is also appropriate for that time.

BUT, what is most important, is a responsive heart at all times to the truth of the Gospel.


